A BILL FOR AN ACT

ORIGINAL

RELATING TO DENTAL ASSISTANTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that thirty-eight states 1 2 and the District of Columbia require some form of certification 3 or licensure for dental assistants. However, dental assistants 4 are not currently required to be certified or otherwise regulated in Hawaii. The legislature notes that the University 5 6 of Hawaii, Kapiolani community college offers a dental assisting certification program, accredited by the Commission on Dental 7 Accreditation of the American Dental Association. Furthermore, 8 Kapiolani community college's dental assisting program offers 9 pathways to certification as a certified dental assistant via 10 11 passage of an examination offered by the Dental Assisting 12 National Board, Inc.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require the auditor to conduct a sunrise analysis on the effects of regulation of dental assistants in the State via the certification options for dental assistants offered by Kapiolani community college's dental assisting program.
