A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE FESTIVAL OF PACIFIC ARTS.

RE IT ENACTED BY THE I ECISI ATUDE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII.

	DE II ENACIED DI THE DEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII.
1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the festival of
2	pacific arts has been held approximately every four years since
3	its founding in 1972, bringing together a delegation of at least
4	two thousand five hundred artists, performers, and cultural
5	practitioners from different nations in Oceania to preserve and
6	perpetuate the arts and culture of their indigenous peoples.
7	The festival of pacific arts is the largest gathering in which
8	Pacific peoples unite to respect and appreciate one another, and
9	during the festival, delegations from twenty-seven Pacific
10	island nations and territories share and exchange their
11	cultures. Visitors from around the world come to the festival
12	of pacific arts to appreciate what the artists, performers,
13	cultural practitioners, and host country have to offer, thereby
14	creating a global market for art, ideas, and products.
15	The legislature further finds that the first festival of
16	pacific arts was held in Fiji in 1972, followed by New Zealand
17	in 1976, Papua New Guinea in 1980, French Polynesia in 1985,

- 1 Caledonia in 2000, Palau in 2004, American Samoa in 2008,
- 2 Solomon Islands in 2012, and Guam in 2016. Hawai'i has finally
- 3 been selected to host the thirteenth festival of pacific arts in
- 4 2020, since Hawai'i delegations have attended every festival
- 5 since 1976.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to create a temporary commission
- 7 on the thirteenth festival of pacific arts to plan for the
- 8 historic event to be held in Honolulu from June 11 to June 27,
- 9 2020.
- 10 SECTION 2. (a) For the purposes of this Act, the term
- 11 "commission" means the temporary commission on the thirteenth
- 12 festival of pacific arts.
- 13 (b) The commission shall be placed within the department
- 14 of business, economic development, and tourism for
- 15 administrative purposes.
- 16 (c) The commission shall be composed of the following
- 17 members:
- 18 (1) The governor or the governor's designee;
- 19 (2) The president of the senate or the president's
- 20 designee;

1	(3)	The speaker of the house of representatives or the
2		speaker's designee;
3	(4)	The director of business, economic development, and
4		tourism or the director's designee;
5	(5)	The president and chief executive officer of the
6		Hawaii tourism authority or the president and chief
7		executive officer's designee;
8	(6)	The chief executive officer of the office of Hawaiian
9		affairs or the chief executive officer's designee;
10	(7)	The mayor of the city and county of Honolulu or the
11		mayor's designee; and
12	(8)	Two members of the community preferably with
13		experience in cultural and international festivals to
14		be appointed by the governor.
15	(d)	The commission shall select one of its members to
16	serve as	chairperson.
17	(e)	The members of the commission shall serve without
18	compensat	ion but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including
19	travel ex	penses, necessary for the performance of their duties.

SECTION 3. The commission:

	. (±)	Sharr serve as the coordinating agency for air state-
2		sponsored and other celebration events staged during
3		the celebration period as designated by the
4		chairperson to assure activities planned are timely
5		and appropriate to commemorate the thirteenth festival
6		of pacific arts;
7	(2)	Shall solicit funding from private and public sources
8		for the purposes of paragraph (1);
9	(3)	May accept appropriations from the State, counties,
10		foreign governments, intergovernmental agencies, and
11		non-governmental agencies for the purposes of
12		paragraph (1);
13	(4)	May accept donations of money and personal property
14	,	from private and public sources; provided that all
15		such donations are recorded and appropriately
16		accounted for; and
17	(5)	Shall submit a report of its activities and proposed
18		activities, plans, and recommendations, including any
19		proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than
20		twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
21		session of 2018.

- 3 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000 or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 for the
- 6 commission to plan for the festival of pacific arts to be held
- 7 in Honolulu from June 11 to June 27, 2020.
- 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 9 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
- 10 this Act.
- 11 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
