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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE FEDERAL FUNDING POLICY STUDY.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to address the
 federal funding policy study mandated by Act 225, Session Laws
 of Hawaii 2016.

Specifically, this Act amends Act 225 to change the state
agency charged with conducting the federal funding policy study
required by that Act, specify the fiscal period to be covered by
the study, and extend the deadline for the study.

8 The legislature finds that the department of budget and 9 finance is more appropriate than the office of the governor to 10 conduct the federal funding policy study. Specifically, the 11 office of federal awards management within the department of 12 budget and finance currently monitors federal funds received by 13 the State and bears the major responsibility for budgetary 14 policies. Most importantly, the department of budget and 15 finance must work towards assuring that the resources of the State are sufficient to fund necessary expenditures in the 16 short- and long-term. 1 SECTION 2. Act 225, Session Laws of Hawaii 2016, is 2 amended by amending sections 1 through 3 to read as follows: "SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to address federal 3 4 funds for state government. 5 More specifically, this Act requires the [office of the 6 governor] department of budget and finance to conduct a federal 7 funding policy study [-] and report findings and recommendations 8 to the governor. 9 The legislature finds that the preparation of a study of 10 federal funding is necessary for state public policymakers to 11 better understand the possible consequences of major reductions 12 in federal funding of state government programs and projects. 13 The legislature intends for the study to result in a policy from 14 the governor that reduces the dependence of state government on 15 federal funds. 16 SECTION 2. (a) The [office of the governor] department of 17 budget and finance shall prepare a federal funding policy study 18 for the State. 19 [The] As part of the federal funding policy study, the (b) 20 office of federal awards management of the department of budget 21 and finance shall:

1	The sum-appropriated shall-be expended by the office of the
2	governor for the purposes of this Act.] There is appropriated
3	out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of
4	\$100,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
5	2017-2018 for the preparation of the federal funding policy
6	study; provided that this appropriation shall not lapse at the
7	end of fiscal year 2017-2018; provided further that all moneys
8	that are unencumbered as of December 31, 2018, shall lapse as of
9	that date.
10	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
11	budget and finance for the purposes of this Act."
12	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
13	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
