A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

PART I. GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. This Act shall be known and may be cited as the Judiciary Appropriations Act of 2017.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS. Unless otherwise clear from the context, as used in this Act:

"Means of financing" or "MOF" means the source from which funds are appropriated or authorized to be expended for the programs and projects specified in this Act. All appropriations are followed by letter symbols. The letter symbols, where used, shall have the following meanings:

- A general funds
- B special funds
- C general obligation bond funds
- N federal funds
- P other federal funds
- W revolving funds



1 "Position ceiling" means the maximum number of permanent
2 and temporary full-time equivalent positions authorized for a
3 particular program during a specified period or periods, as
4 denoted by an asterisk for permanent full-time equivalent
5 positions and a pound sign for temporary full-time equivalent
6 positions.

7 "Program ID" means the unique identifier for the specific
8 program and consists of the abbreviation for the judiciary (JUD)
9 followed by the organization number for the program.

10 **PART II. PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

11 SECTION 3. The following sums, or so much thereof as may
12 be sufficient to accomplish the purposes and programs designated
13 herein, are appropriated or authorized from the sources of
14 funding specified to the judiciary for the fiscal biennium
15 beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. The total
16 expenditures and the number of permanent and temporary full-time
17 equivalent positions established in each fiscal year of the
18 fiscal biennium shall not exceed the sums and the position
19 ceilings indicated for each year, except as otherwise provided
20 in this Act or as provided by general law.

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PART III. PROGRAM APPROPRIATION PROVISIONS

SECTION 4. Provided that whenever the need arises, the chief justice, in administering an equitable and expeditious judicial process, may transfer sufficient funds and positions between programs for operating purposes; provided further that no transfer shall be made to implement any collective bargaining contract signed after this legislature adjourns sine die.

SECTION 5. Provided that if the chief justice, any agency, or any government unit secures federal funds or other property under any act of Congress or any funds or other property from private organizations or individuals that are to be expended in connection with any program or works authorized by this Act or otherwise, the chief justice or the agency, with the chief justice's approval, may enter into the undertaking with the federal government, private organization, or individual.

SECTION 6. Provided that the judiciary may transfer savings from its general fund appropriation to the driver education and training fund to accommodate any temporary cash flow deficits.

SECTION 7. Provided that the chief justice:
(1) Shall expend the general funds transferred for fiscal year 2017-2018 and fiscal year 2018-2019 under section



1 21 of the General Appropriations Act of 2017 to the
2 judiciary from the office of the public defender
3 (BUF151) for the administration and operation of the
4 community court outreach project during the applicable
5 fiscal year, including payment of the personal
6 services costs for the positions listed under
7 paragraph (3);

8 (2) Shall assign the transferred general funds to the
9 budget program ID deemed appropriate by the chief
10 justice; and

11 (3) May establish one of more of the following permanent
12 positions, which shall be additional to the position
13 ceilings of part II, for the administration and
14 operation of the community court outreach project:

15 (A) 1.00 permanent court coordinator; or

16 (B) 1.00 permanent social worker; and

17 (4) The chief justice shall submit a report on the
18 community court outreach project to the legislature no
19 later than twenty days prior to the regular sessions
20 of 2018 and 2019. Additionally, if requested by the
21 public defender, the chief justice shall include in
22 the report required under this paragraph the community



1 court outreach project memoranda of agreement required
2 in section 21 of the General Appropriations Act of
3 2017.

4 **PART IV. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS**

5 SECTION 8. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS AUTHORIZED. The
6 sums of money appropriated or authorized in part II of this Act
7 for capital improvements shall be expended for the projects
8 listed below. Several related or similar projects may be
9 combined into a single project if such combination is
10 advantageous or convenient for implementation; provided that the
11 total cost of the projects thus combined shall not exceed the
12 total of the sums specified for the projects separately. The
13 amount after each cost element and the amount of total funding
14 for each project in this part are listed in thousands of
15 dollars.

1 PART V. ISSUANCE OF BONDS

2 SECTION 9. General obligation bonds may be issued, as
3 provided by law, to yield the amount that may be necessary to
4 finance projects authorized in part II and listed in part IV of
5 this Act; provided that the sum total of the general obligation
6 bonds so issued shall not exceed \$9,350,000.

7 PART VI. SPECIAL PROVISIONS

8 SECTION 10. Any law or any provision of this Act to the
9 contrary notwithstanding, the appropriations made for capital
10 improvement projects authorized in part II and listed in part IV
11 of this Act shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year for
12 which the appropriations are made; provided that all
13 appropriations made for fiscal year 2017-2018 and fiscal year
14 2018-2019 that are unencumbered as of June 30, 2020, shall lapse
15 as of that date.

16 SECTION 11. The judiciary may delegate to other state or
17 county agencies the planning, acquisition of land, design,
18 construction, and equipment of any capital improvement project
19 when it is determined by the judiciary to be advantageous to do
20 so.

21 SECTION 12. Where it has been determined that changed
22 conditions, such as a reduction in the particular population



1 being served, permit the reduction in the scope of a project
2 listed in part IV of this Act, the chief justice may authorize
3 such reduction of project scope.

4 SECTION 13. The chief justice shall determine when and the
5 manner in which the authorized capital improvement projects
6 shall be initiated. The chief justice shall notify the governor
7 from time to time of the specific amounts required for the
8 projects, and the governor shall provide for those amounts
9 through the issuance of bonds authorized in part V of this Act.

10 SECTION 14. Any law or any provision of this Act to the
11 contrary notwithstanding, the chief justice may supplement funds
12 for any cost element of a capital improvement project authorized
13 under this Act by transferring such sums as may be necessary
14 from the funds appropriated for other cost elements of the same
15 project by this Act or by any other prior or future Act that has
16 not lapsed; provided that the total expenditure of funds for all
17 cost elements for the project shall not exceed the total
18 appropriation for that project.

19 **PART VII. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS AND EFFECTIVE DATE**

20 SECTION 15. If any portion of this Act or its application
21 to any person, entity, or circumstance is held to be invalid for
22 any reason, the legislature declares that the remainder of the



1 Act and each and every other provision thereof shall not be
2 affected thereby. If any portion of a specific appropriation is
3 held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall
4 be expended to fulfill the objective of such appropriation to
5 the extent possible.

6 SECTION 16. If manifest clerical, typographical, or other
7 mechanical errors are found in this Act, the chief justice may
8 correct such errors.

9 SECTION 17. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.


