A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 "§132D- Liability of property owner. A property owner 5 who knowingly allows an individual to possess, set off, ignite, 6 or otherwise cause to explode any aerial device while on the 7 owner's property shall be deemed to be in violation of this 8 chapter and shall be subject to the penalties thereunder." 9 SECTION 2. Section 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended by amending the definition of "aerial device" to read as 11 follows: ""Aerial device" means any fireworks [containing one 12 13 hundred thirty milligrams or less of explosive materials that 14 produces an audible or visible effect and is designed to rise **15** into the air and explode or detonate in the air or to fly about 16 above the ground, and that is prohibited for use by any person **17** who does not have a permit for display issued by a county under

- 10 SECTION 3. Section 132D-20, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 "§132D-20 Enforcement[-]; probable cause for arrest. (a)
- 13 This chapter shall be enforced by each county. The counties are
- 14 authorized to enforce and administer the provisions of this
- 15 chapter.
- (b) Arrests for offenses under this chapter or under a
- 17 county fireworks ordinance shall be made in compliance with
- 18 chapter 803. Probable cause for the arrests may be established
- 19 based on:

1	(1)	Statements from individuals who witnessed the offense,
2		even if those individuals are not law enforcement

4	(2)	Photographs, video recordings, or other recordings

7	SECT	ION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
8	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
9	begun before its effective date.	
10	SECT	ION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
11	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.	
12	SECT	ION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Fireworks; Arrests; Probable Cause

Description:

Allows probable cause for fireworks offenses to be established from statements from witnesses and photographs, video, and other recordings authenticated by witnesses. Simplifies definition of aerial device. Establishes offense applicable to property owners for aerial devices possessed or set off on their property by others. (HB1172 HD2)
