

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. (a) The department of commerce and consumer
2	affairs shall conduct a study on the necessity and feasibility
3	of establishing an agency within the department of commerce and
4	consumer affairs to provide general regulatory oversight of
5	homeowners associations. As part of the study, the department
6	of commerce and consumer affairs shall determine the most
7	effective and cost efficient means to establish an agency that
8	would, at a minimum:
9	(1) Focus on the provision of consumer protection services
10	for homeowners including the proper use of fees paid
11	to an association;
12	(2) Establish accountability standards and benchmarks for
13	the choosing of vendors by a homeowners association to
14	provide agreed upon services, as well as the vendors
15	used by the association to provide these services;
16	(3) Facilitate mediation, arbitration, and dispute
17	resolution services in cases of noncompliance or

1		negrect of appropriate revers of performance,
2		including economic performance, for agreed upon
3		services between the homeowner and homeowners
4		association or vendor procured by the association;
5	(4)	Enforce any statutes, regulations, and administrative
6		rules governing homeowners associations, including the
7		enforcement of penalties and determination of
8		liabilities, as appropriate;
9	(5)	Have the authority to compel compliance with any
10		statute, regulation, and administrative rule through
11		legal actions;
12	(6)	Recommend, to the director of commerce and consumer
13		affairs, the establishment of any additional penalties
14		the agency deems necessary for proper enforcement of
15		any statute, regulation, or administrative rule
16		governing homeowners associations;
17	(7)	Establish educational programs for homeowners and
18		disseminate information to homeowners on a homeowners
19		rights, including challenging the appropriateness of
20		fees paid versus services provided and the
21		availability of mediation and dispute resolution; and

1	(8)	Establish regular reporting requirements to the			
2		legislature including agency evaluations, metrics, and			
3		fiscal accountability.			
4	(b)	As part of the study under subsection (a), the			
5	department	t of commerce and consumer affairs shall perform a cost			
6	benefit ar	nalysis on the establishment of an agency as provided			
7	in subsection (a) including initial start-up costs, year to year				
8	operational costs, and any other incidental agency and program				
9	maintenance costs.				
10	(c)	The department of commerce and consumer affairs shall			
11	submit a	report of its findings and recommendations, including			
12	any propos	sed legislation, to the legislature no later than			
13	twenty day	ys prior to the convening of the regular session of
