A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AWARDED FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. In 2007, the state building code council was
- 2 created to review and adopt current, nationally-recognized
- 3 building codes and standards to ensure compliance with
- 4 requirements of building safety, the National Flood Insurance
- 5 Program, hurricane and earthquake resiliency standards, energy
- 6 efficiency, fire safety, and technological advances in building
- 7 materials and methods.
- 8 The legislature finds that since funding was never provided
- 9 to the state building code council for staff and operational
- 10 expenses, the effectiveness of the council's eleven voting
- 11 members has been limited.
- 12 The state building code council applied for federal funds
- 13 that were available through the Federal Emergency Management
- 14 Agency Hazard Mitigation Grant Program to fund the adoption of
- 15 the hurricane and earthquake resiliency standards in the 2012

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1	international building code and Hawaii-specific amendments		
2	approved by the council.		
3	In Nov	ember 2016, the department of accounting and general	
4	services re	ceived notification that the Federal Emergency	
5	Management Agency Hazard Mitigation Grant Program awarded the		
6	State a reimbursement grant for a project entitled "Hawaii state		
7	building code administrative rules to implement updated		
8	statewide s	tandards for hurricane mitigation". Under terms of	
9	the reimbursement grant, the department of accounting and		
10	general services is required to use its operating funds to		
11	accomplish the project and, after a review, the Federal		
12	Emergency M	anagement Agency will reimburse the State up to	
13	\$75,000. T	he \$75,000 award amount comprises:	
14	(1) \$	60,000 for a consultant to provide services to assist	
15	t	he state building code council with the timely	
16	р	erformance of all tasks required to complete the	
17	Н	awaii rule-making process under chapter 91, Hawaii	
18	R	evised Statutes, including publication and	
19	a	dvertising costs required for a public hearing; and	
20	(2) \$	15,000 for management of the consultant contract by	
21	t	he department of accounting and general services.	

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1	The volunteer members of the state building code council		
2	will also provide an additional in-kind soft match of \$25,000		
3	for the State. The Federal Emergency Management Agency Hazard		
4	Mitigation Grant will enable the state building code council to		
5	fulfill its statutory obligation to update the state building		
6	code once every six years. The latest update occurred in 2010		
7	and was based on the 2006 international building code, which is		
8	four versions behind the latest version. Hawaii is among the		
9	last few states using an obsolete building code that is		
10	considered inadequate by the Federal Emergency Management Agency		
11	and this situation jeopardizes timely, Federal Emergency		
12	Management Agency post-disaster aid to Hawaii.		
13	The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for the		
14	state building code council to update the state building code		
15	and secure a reimbursement grant from the Federal Emergency		
16	Management Agency Hazard Mitigation Grant Program.		
17	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general		
18	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$75,000 or so much		
19	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 for the		
20	state building code council to update the state building code		

- 1 and secure a reimbursement grant from the Federal Emergency
- 2 Management Agency Hazard Mitigation Grant Program.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 4 of accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 All reimbursements from the Federal Emergency Management
- 6 Agency grant described in this section for any portion of the
- 7 sum appropriated under this section shall be deposited into the
- 8 general fund.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2099.
