
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The department of business, economic
2 development, and tourism is authorized to establish and fill one
3 permanent state public-private partnership coordinator position
4 exempt from the provisions of chapter 76, to be placed under the
5 director of business, economic development, and tourism to
6 manage all public-private partnerships entered into by the State
7 and manage all contracts, proposals, and negotiations associated
8 with the State's public-private partnerships.

9 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the
12 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
13 2018-2019 to establish the state public-private partnership
14 coordinator position to carry out the purposes of this Act;
15 provided that this position may be added to the position count
16 for the department of business, economic development, and
17 tourism.

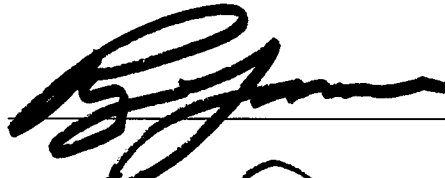

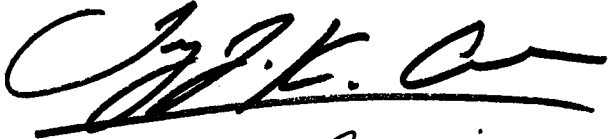
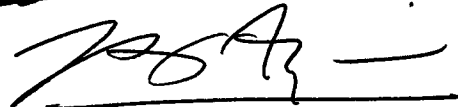




1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
