A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WATER INFRASTRUCTURE LOANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 Section 155-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is SECTION 1. 2 amended by amending the definitions of "water infrastructure 3 charge", "water infrastructure equipment", and "water infrastructure loans" and "loan program" to read as follows: 4 5 "Water infrastructure charge" means the on-bill charges 6 for the use and services of the loan program, including the 7 repayment of loans made under the loan program to be imposed on 8 water utility customers [-] and water utilities. 9 "Water infrastructure equipment" means infrastructure 10 improvements, equipment, and personal property to be installed 11 for dams, reservoirs, hydroelectric pumping, storm water 12 reclamation, ditch maintenance, spillways, wells, water ducts, and water distribution systems. The term includes water tanks. 13 "Water infrastructure loans" and "loan program" means the 14 15 program established by this part and loans made to finance the 16 purchase or installation of water infrastructure equipment for 17 dams, reservoirs, hydroelectric pumping, storm water



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1 reclamation, ditch maintenance, spillways, wells, water ducts, 2 [and] water distribution systems [-], and water tanks." 3 SECTION 2. Section 155-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended to read as follows: 5 "[+] §155-32[+] Hawaii water infrastructure loan program. There is established a Hawaii water infrastructure loan program, 6 7 which shall be a loan program as defined under section 39-51. 8 The program shall be administered by the department in a manner 9 consistent with chapter 39, part III. This loan program may 10 include: 11 (1) Loans made, on terms approved by the department, to 12 [private]: 13 Private entities, whether corporations, (A) 14 partnerships, limited liability companies, or 15 other persons, which entities may lease or 16 provide water infrastructure equipment to utility 17 customers; and 18 (B) Water utilities; and 19 (2) Direct loans to utility customers, on terms approved 20 by the department."



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1 SECTION 3. Section 155-33, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "[+] §155-33[+] Powers of the department. The department 4 shall have the following powers: 5 (1) Make loans and expend funds to finance the purchase or 6 installation of water infrastructure equipment for 7 dams, reservoirs, hydroelectric pumping, storm water 8 reclamation, ditch maintenance, spillways, wells, 9 water ducts, [and] water distribution systems [+], and 10 water tanks; 11 (2)Hold and invest moneys in the water infrastructure 12 special fund in investments as permitted by law; 13 (3) Hire employees necessary to perform its duties; 14 Enter into contracts for the service of consultants (4)15 for rendering professional and technical assistance 16 and advice, and any other contracts that are necessary 17 and proper for the implementation of the loan program; 18 (5) Enter into contracts for the administration of the 19 loan program, in accordance with chapter 103D; 20 (6) Establish loan program guidelines to carry out the 21 purposes of this part;

2		purposes of this part;
3	(8)	Delegate authority to the chairperson of the board of
4		agriculture to approve loans where the requested
5		amount plus any principal balance on existing loans to
6		the applicant does not exceed \$25,000 of state funds;

8	(9)	Adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 necessary for the
9		purpose of this part."
