## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING APPROVAL FROM THE FEDERAL HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION FOR A PROPOSED LOW-INCOME AND WORKFORCE HOUSING PROJECT LOCATED WITHIN THE FOOTPRINT OF A FEDERALLY-FUNDED INTERSTATE HIGHWAY.

WHEREAS, in 2016, almost 8,000 individuals experienced 1 homelessness in Hawaii, according to Partners in Care's annual 2 point in time survey; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, while market rental rates in Hawaii are among the highest in the nation and overall cost of living is the highest, 6 7 average household income in the State is among the lowest; and 8 WHEREAS, Hawaii's income to expense gap has consistently 9 widened over the past 10 years as rents, particularly in 10 11 Honolulu, have consistently risen faster than both wages and inflation; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the State's stock of affordable housing stock is 14 15 insufficient to meet demand, especially for the lowest income households, for which affordable housing is available to less 16 than one-third of households; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, Housing First is a nationally recognized best practice proven to be the most effective and efficient approach 20 to helping people experiencing chronic homelessness get and stay 21 22 off the streets by immediately moving them from the streets or homeless shelters into their own apartments; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, many county, state, and private interests are working together to find innovative solutions to homelessness 26 and Hawaii's housing crisis that adhere to the Housing First 27 28 model; and 29 WHEREAS, one such initiative is a planned transitional 30 housing pilot project on Oahu to be placed on land subject to 31

1 the jurisdiction of the Federal Highway Administration, use of 2 which requires one or more permits or approvals from the Federal 3 Highway Administration; and

5 WHEREAS, as part of the planning and preparation for the 6 housing pilot project, the project developers will soon begin 7 submitting preliminary applications for federal approval; now, 8 therefore,

10 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 11 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 12 of 2017, that the Federal Highway Administration is requested to 13 timely process applications for permits and approvals necessary 14 for the development of a transitional housing pilot project on 15 land subject to Federal Highway Administration jurisdiction and 16 timely approve applications that meet eligibility criteria; and 17

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 19 Resolution be transmitted to the Division Director of the 20 Western Federal Lands Highway Division of the Federal Highway 21 Administration, Governor, Director of Transportation, and Mayor 22 of the City and County of Honolulu.
