HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT THE BOARD OF EDUCATION EXAMINE HAVING COMPUTER SCIENCE CREDITS COUNT TOWARDS HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS TO ENCOURAGE COMPUTER SCIENCE EDUCATION.

1 WHEREAS, there are fewer Advanced Placement examinations 2 taken in computer science than in any other STEM subject area; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, computing occupations comprise up to two-thirds of all projected new jobs in STEM fields and offer higher-paying 6 entry-level jobs than other degrees, making computer science one 7 8 of the most in-demand college degrees; and 9 WHEREAS, computer science drives job creation and 10 11 innovation throughout the nation's economy; and 12 13 WHEREAS, providing students with access to computer science education is a critical step for ensuring that Hawaii remains 14 competitive in the global economy; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, basic technological skills are increasingly necessary in day-to-day life regardless of a student's ultimate 18 19 career choice; and 20 21 WHEREAS, it is therefore the intent of the Legislature that all students have a basic understanding of computer science; 22 23 now, therefore, 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 26 27 of 2017, that the Board of Education is requested to examine having computer science count as a science or math credit for 28 29 high school graduation requirements; and 30
