HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS TO EXAMINE WWOOFING IN HAWAII, REVIEW RELEVANT HAWAII LABOR LAWS, AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS ON HOW TO PROTECT THESE WORKERS.

WHEREAS, there exists a loose network of national 1 organizations that facilitate placement of volunteers on organic 2 farms, commonly known as "WWOOFing", which can stand for either 3 World Wide Opportunities on Organic Farms or Willing Workers on 4 Organic Farms; and 5 6 WHEREAS, there are several organizations that advertise on 7 college campuses across the United States and other outlets to 8 recruit young students to work on organic farms in exchange for 9 room and board; and 10 11 WHEREAS, once WWOOFers arrive at their host farms, they can 12 be exposed to dangerous conditions such as cramped boarding 13 accommodations that may not meet public health standards, 14 extended working hours, inadequate or nonexistent bathroom 15 facilities, drug use, and sexual assault; and 16 17 WHEREAS, WWOOFing has become popular in Hawaii and some 18 WWOOFers find themselves stuck in the State, often in poverty, 19 after completing their agreed-upon time on the farm; and 20 21 WHEREAS, presently, there are no rules or regulations in 22 place for these WWOOFing exchange programs; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the Legislature believes there is a need to 25 evaluate these placements to determine if regulations, such as 26 certification, permitting, or registration, would reduce the 27 risks associated with WWOOFing in Hawaii; now, therefore, 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 30 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 31

of 2017, that the Legislature requests the Department of Labor
 and Industrial Relations to examine WWOOFing in Hawaii, review
 relevant Hawaii labor laws, and make recommendations on how to
 protect these workers; and

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Labor and 7 Industrial Relations submit a report on the prevalence of 8 WWOOFing in the State, whether any safeguards should be 9 established to protect persons participating in WWOOFing in the 10 State, and include proposed legislation, if any, to the 11 Legislature not later than twenty days prior to the convening of 12 the 2018 Regular Session; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and the Director of
Labor and Industrial Relations.
