SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO ISSUE A PROCLAMATION TO DESIGNATE
SHAVE ICE AS THE OFFICIAL STATE SNACK OF THE STATE OF
HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, because of Hawaii's historically diverse culture,
2 the State is often celebrated around the world as being a place
3 of many unique tastes and flavors; and
4

5 WHEREAS, one of these unique foods is shave ice, which came
6 to Hawaii by way of Japanese sugar plantation laborers; and
7

8 WHEREAS, as these Japanese plantation laborers began
9 transitioning from the plantations to opening their own local
10 businesses, they would often offer shave ice in their stores,
11 which became extremely popular among Hawaii residents; and
12

13 WHEREAS, although variations of shave ice exist around the
14 world under different names, the shave ice in Hawaii is
15 particularly unique in how the ice is cut and the variety of
16 toppings and other treats incorporated in the snack; and
17

18 WHEREAS, even today, shave ice continues to be popular with
19 local residents and tourists; and
20

21 WHEREAS, former President of the United States Barack Obama
22 enjoys eating shave ice with his family when he visits Hawaii;

25 WHEREAS, although several states have designated certain
26 foods as state snacks, including Illinois, New York, South
27 Carolina, Texas, and Utah, Hawaii does not have an official
28 state snack; and

30 WHEREAS, declaring shave ice as the State's official state
31 snack further celebrates the diverse food culture in Hawaii and

1 creates a stronger association with the State and one of its
2 most iconic snacks; now, therefore,

3
4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-ninth
5 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2017, the
6 House of Representatives concurring, that the Governor is
7 requested to issue a proclamation to designate shave ice as the
8 official state snack of the State of Hawaii; and

10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
11 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor.
