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# SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE JUDICIARY, IN COOPERATION WITH THE POLICE  
DEPARTMENT OF EACH COUNTY AND PROSECUTOR OF EACH COUNTY, TO  
ANNUALLY COMPILE AND REPORT ON STATISTICS REGARDING  
ARRESTS, CHARGES, AND CONVICTIONS OR OTHER DISPOSITIONS  
BASED ON OR RELATED TO THE OFFENSE OF ABUSE OF A FAMILY OR  
HOUSEHOLD MEMBER.

1           WHEREAS, domestic violence is a serious social issue in  
2 Hawaii; and

3  
4           WHEREAS, despite a number of state laws that protect  
5 victims of domestic violence, aim to prevent future incidents of  
6 domestic violence, and penalize and provide assistance to  
7 domestic violence offenders, the rates of domestic violence  
8 occurring in Hawaii have not decreased; and

9  
10           WHEREAS, of greater concern is the number of domestic  
11 violence incidents committed by repeat domestic violence  
12 offenders; and

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14           WHEREAS, advocates for stronger domestic violence laws  
15 contend that part of the problem is that existing law is being  
16 circumvented, resulting in a lack of any real consequences on  
17 domestic violence offenders, and consequently, no change in  
18 their behavior; and

20           WHEREAS, it is necessary to obtain accurate data, from  
21 arrest to final judicial action, in order to determine if more  
22 tailored laws are necessary to ensure that domestic violence  
23 offenders receive appropriate consequences and services for  
24 offenders to change their behavior and reduce repeat offenses;

1 WHEREAS, current uniform crime statistics data do not focus  
 2 on the offense of abuse of a family or household member, and  
 3 therefore it is necessary for the criminal justice system to  
 4 provide specific insight on how arrests, charges, and  
 5 convictions or other dispositions based on or related to the  
 6 offense of abuse of a family or household member are currently  
 7 handled by the police, county prosecutors, and courts in order  
 8 to establish and implement more tailored laws that prevent  
 9 domestic violence; now, therefore,

 11 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-ninth  
 12 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2017, the  
 13 House of Representatives concurring, that the Judiciary, in  
 14 cooperation with the police department of each county and  
 15 prosecutor of each county, is requested to annually compile and  
 16 report on statistics regarding arrests, charges, and convictions  
 17 or other dispositions based on or related to the offense of  
 18 abuse of a family or household member; and

 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in compiling this annual  
 21 statistical report, the Judiciary is requested to collect the  
 22 following information from the police department of each county:

 24 (1) The number of arrests made pursuant to section 709-  
 25 906, Hawaii Revised Statutes;
- 26  
 27 (2) The number of cases based on arrests made pursuant to  
 28 section 709-906, Hawaii Revised Statutes, referred to  
 29 the county prosecutor;

 31 (3) The number of investigations relating to section 709-  
 32 906, Hawaii Revised Statutes, that are pending on  
 33 June 30, 2017, 2018, and 2019; and

 35 (4) The number of cases relating to section 709-906,  
 36 Hawaii Revised Statutes, that were closed and not  
 37 referred to the county prosecutor for further action;

 41 statistical report, the Judiciary is requested to collect the  
 42 following information from the prosecutor of each county:

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33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Judiciary is requested to  
34 provide in this annual statistical report:

2 disposition;

4 (3) The number of cases that resulted in misdemeanor  
5 convictions of section 709-906, Hawaii Revised  
6 Statutes, were dismissed, or resulted in any other  
7 disposition; and

9 (4) The number of cases that resulted in a conviction of a  
10 lesser included offense of section 709-906, Hawaii  
11 Revised Statutes, or other criminal offense, were  
12 dismissed, or resulted in any other disposition,  
13 including a deferred acceptance of guilty plea or nolo  
14 contendere plea; and

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Judiciary is requested to  
17 submit a written report of its findings and recommendations,  
18 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later  
19 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Sessions  
20 of 2018, 2019, and 2020; and

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
23 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chief Justice of the  
24 Supreme Court of Hawaii, Administrative Director of the Courts,  
25 Chief of Police of the City and County of Honolulu, Chief of  
26 Police of the County of Hawaii, Chief of Police of the County of  
27 Maui, Chief of Police of the County of Kauai, Prosecutor of the  
28 City and County of Honolulu, Prosecutor of the County of Hawaii,  
29 Prosecutor of the County of Maui, and Prosecutor of the County  
30 of Kauai.
