SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING A STUDY ON THE PER-PUPIL FUNDING SYSTEM FOR PUBLIC
CHARTER SCHOOLS TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE SYSTEM FULFILLS
ITS STATUTORY PURPOSE OF EQUALIZING OPERATIONAL FUNDING
AMONG PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii's public charter schools are a part of the
2 state public education system and contribute to that system as a
3 whole by providing alternative educational options and modeling
4 innovative practices; and

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6 WHEREAS, each public charter school is a single state
7 entity, self-governed by a volunteer governing board,
8 independently managed, and primarily dependent on state funding
9 in order to operate; and

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11 WHEREAS, charter schools receive the majority of their
12 funding through general fund appropriations based on a general
13 fund per-pupil allotment, which is based on a formula that adds
14 up the total funding allocated to certain programs within the
15 Department of Education and then distributes monies based on
16 reasonable projected enrollment figures for each public charter
17 school; and

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19 WHEREAS, section 302D-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, mandates
20 that the non-facility general fund per-pupil funding for public
21 charter school students be the same as the general fund per-
22 pupil amount provided to the Department of Education in its most
23 recently approved executive budget; and

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25 WHEREAS, questions have been raised about whether the per-
26 pupil funding system equalizes funding for public charter
27 schools as intended; and

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29 WHEREAS, public charter schools must also meet other
30 expenses, including facility costs; and

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1 WHEREAS, the State Public Charter School Commission has
2 warned in its annual reports that financial data from the public
3 charter schools reveal short-term financial strain as well as
4 long-term operational sustainability challenges; now, therefore,
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6 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-ninth
7 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2017, the
8 House of Representatives concurring, that the Legislative
9 Reference Bureau is requested to conduct a study on the per-
10 pupil funding system to determine whether the system fulfills
11 its statutory purpose of equalizing operational funding among
12 public schools; and
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14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education and
15 State Public Charter School Commission are requested to come to
16 an agreement on:
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- 18 (1) The per-pupil funding system cost categories to be
19 reported to the Legislative Reference Bureau;
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- 21 (2) What is to be included in these categories;
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- 23 (3) The format for data submission; and
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- 25 (4) Any other fiscal information that would be relevant to
26 the Legislative Reference Bureau's study,
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28 prior to any data being submitted to the Legislative Reference
29 Bureau; and
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31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that by June 30, 2017, the
32 Department of Education and State Public Charter School
33 Commission are requested to provide specific data to the
34 Legislative Reference Bureau detailing what the present system
35 of funding is comprised of within the statutory allocation, to
36 permit the Bureau to target its study and complete it in a
37 timely manner; and
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39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Public Charter School
40 Commission, Hawaii Public Charter School Network, Hawaii
41 Educational Policy Center, and other stakeholder agencies are



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requested to provide other information and assistance as requested by the Legislative Reference Bureau; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2019; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the Legislative Reference Bureau, Chairperson of the Board of Education, Superintendent of Education, Chairperson of the State Public Charter School Commission, Executive Director of the State Public Charter School Commission, Executive Director of the Hawaii Public Charter School Network, and Director of the Hawaii Educational Policy Center.
