SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO ESTABLISH A WORKING GROUP TO STUDY THE POTENTIAL TRANSFER OF THE ROYAL MAUSOLEUM AT MAUNA 'ALA TO ONE OR MORE APPROPRIATE NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS AND RECOMMEND THE TERMS OF THE TRANSFER, MANAGEMENT, AND ONGOING MAINTENANCE OF MAUNA 'ALA.

1 WHEREAS, the Royal Mausoleum at Mauna 'Ala in Nu'uano,
2 Honolulu, is the 2.7 acre sacred wahi pana of many of Hawai'i's
3 Ali'i (sovereigns and chiefs) and their confidants; and

5 WHEREAS, Mauna 'Ala is currently owned and managed by the
6 Division of State Parks of the Department of Land and Natural
7 Resources; and
8

9 WHEREAS, under the guidance of the Mauna 'Ala Curator, Kahu
10 William Bishop Kaihe'ekai Maioho, the Department of Land and
11 Natural Resources bears the primary responsibility for managing
12 and maintaining Mauna 'Ala, along with the support of the Estate
13 of Bernice Pauahi Bishop, the Queen Lili'uokalani Trust, the King
14 Lunalilo Trust, the Abigail K.K. Kawānanakoa Foundation, The
15 Queen's Health Systems, and the Charles Reed Bishop Trust,
16 referred to collectively as the Royal Parties; and

18 WHEREAS, the Department of Land and Natural Resources,
19 Royal Parties, and the Kahu of Mauna 'Ala have engaged in a
20 cooperative effort to fund and undertake badly needed repairs
21 and renovations at Mauna 'Ala; and
22

23 WHEREAS, there is a need to transfer the ongoing
24 stewardship and maintenance of Mauna 'Ala to one or more non-
25 profit organizations with culturally-sensitive property
26 management expertise, financial resources, and strong
27 genealogical and cultural ties to Mauna 'Ala to assist the Kahu



1 of Mauna 'Ala with the ongoing management and maintenance of
2 Mauna 'Ala for the benefit of the public; now, therefore,

3
4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-ninth
5 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2017, the
6 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Land
7 and Natural Resources is requested to establish a working group
8 to study the potential transfer of The Royal Mausoleum at Mauna
9 'Ala to one or more appropriate non-profit organizations and
10 recommend the terms for the transfer, management, and ongoing
11 maintenance of Mauna 'Ala; and

13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested
14 to consist of the following eight members:

16 (1) The Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural
17 Resources, or the Chairperson's designee;
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19 (2) One representative from each of the Royal Parties; and

21 (3) Kahu William Bishop Kaihe'ekai Maioho, Kahu of Mauna
22 'Ala; and

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the working
25 group select a chairperson from among themselves, and the
26 chairperson is requested to schedule and convene working group
27 meetings; and

29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested
30 to:

32 (1) Determine whether it is in the best interest of the
33 descendants of the Royal Parties and the people of
34 Hawai'i to transfer ownership and management of Mauna
35 'Ala in perpetuity to one or more appropriate non-
36 profit organizations with culturally-sensitive
37 property management expertise, financial resources,
38 and strong familial and cultural ties to Mauna 'Ala;

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1 (2) If so, develop and recommend the terms of such
 2 transfer of Mauna 'Ala, including any proposed state
 3 actions and a timeline for the implementation of such
 4 state actions; and
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6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested
 7 to submit a report of the working group's findings, analyses,
 8 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
 9 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
 10 the Regular Session of 2018; and

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group cease to
 13 exist on June 30, 2018; and

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
 16 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
 17 Board of Land and Natural Resources, Estate of Bernice Pauahi
 18 Bishop, Queen Lili'uokalani Trust, King Lunalilo Trust, Abigail
 19 K.K. Kawānanakoa Foundation, The Queen's Health Systems, Charles
 20 Reed Bishop Trust, and Kahu William Bishop Kaihe'ekai Maioho.
