SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO ADOPT ADMINISTRATIVE
RULES TO BAN SMOKING AND THE USE OF ELECTRONIC SMOKING
DEVICES IN FOSTER CARE HOMES.

1 WHEREAS, according to the American Cancer Society, there is
2 no safe level of exposure for secondhand smoke as secondhand
3 smoke has the same harmful chemicals that smokers inhale; and
4

5 WHEREAS, according to the American Lung Association, while
6 electronic smoking devices do not contain smoke, they still
7 expose people to secondhand emissions containing formaldehyde
8 and other harmful carcinogens; and

10 WHEREAS, making a home smoke-free may be one of the most
11 important things that can be done for the benefit of the family;
12 and

14 WHEREAS, according to the Public Health Law Center at
15 William Mitchell College of Law, numerous states prohibit
16 smoking in foster homes and vehicles when a foster child is
17 present or otherwise prohibit exposure of a foster child to
18 secondhand smoke; and

20 WHEREAS, Hawaii should join those states that protect
21 children in foster care from exposure to secondhand smoke and
22 emissions from electronic smoking devices; and

24 WHEREAS, the Department of Human Services has regulatory
25 jurisdiction over foster care homes; now, therefore,

27 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-ninth
28 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2017,
29 that the Department of Human Services is urged to adopt
30 administrative rules to ban smoking and the use of electronic
31 smoking devices in foster care homes; and
