
SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A PHILIPPINES-HAWAII TOURISM
COLLEGE STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM COMPACT.

1 WHEREAS, House Concurrent Resolution No. 124, H.D. 1
2 (1985), established the State of Hawaii's first sister-state
3 relationship with the Philippines, with the Province of Ilocos
4 Sur, and noted that Filipino immigrants and their descendants
5 have contributed greatly to the economy, cultural diversity, and
6 strength of Hawaii's society; and
7

8 WHEREAS, on December 20, 1906, the first fifteen Filipinos,
9 known as sakadas or plantation workers, arrived in the State
10 from the Province of Ilocos Sur to help with Hawaii's sugar
11 plantations; and
12

13 WHEREAS, Act 7, Session Laws of Hawaii 2015, recognized the
14 historical significance of the arrival of the first sakadas in
15 the State by designating December 20 of each year as "Sakada
16 Day"; and

18 WHEREAS, the Province of Ilocos Sur will celebrate its
19 bicentennial anniversary on February 1-3, 2018; and
20

21 WHEREAS, in 2015, the City of Vigan, the capital of the
22 Province of Ilocos Sur, was officially inaugurated as one of the
23 world's new urban wonder cities; and

25 WHEREAS, as an emerging tourist destination, Vigan is an
26 example of the growth of global tourism, which is a significant
27 industry for the State; and

29 WHEREAS, House Concurrent Resolution No. 48 (2002)
30 requested the Governor and the President of the University of
31 Hawaii to establish sister-state educational, cultural, and
32 economic development exchanges with the Province of Ilocos Sur;

1 WHEREAS, Ilocos Sur Community College was founded in 1975
2 and started its tourism management program in 1992; and
3

4 WHEREAS, the University of Northern Philippines was founded
5 in 1965 and started its college of hospitality and tourism
6 management in 1997; and
7

8 WHEREAS, the worldwide reputation of the University of
9 Hawaii System, through the University of Hawaii at Manoa School
10 of Travel Industry Management, the hospitality and tourism
11 programs of University of Hawaii West Oahu, and participating
12 University of Hawaii community colleges can be enhanced to
13 become exemplary programs in hospitality, tourism, and
14 transportation management by establishing a student exchange
15 program compact with Ilocos Sur Community College and the
16 University of Northern Philippines; now, therefore,
17

18 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-ninth
19 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2017,
20 that University of Hawaii System is requested to establish a
21 student exchange program compact between the University of
22 Hawaii System and the University of Northern Philippines College
23 of Hospitality and Tourism Management and the Ilocos Sur
24 Community College Tourism Management Program; and

26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the student exchange program
27 compact be known as the "Philippines-Hawaii Tourism College
28 Student Exchange Program Compact" (Compact); and

30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Compact shall focus on the
31 areas of hospitality, tourism, and transportation management
32 exchanges; and

34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Compact shall emphasize the
35 development of a plan to foster communication, cooperation, and
36 courtesies among the participants to explore different avenues
37 of hospitality, tourism, and transportation management
38 exchanges; and

40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Dean of the University of
41 Hawaii at Manoa School of Travel Industry Management, with the
42 cooperation of the Chancellors from University of Hawaii West



1 Oahu and participating University of Hawaii community colleges,
2 shall report findings and recommendations relative to the
3 Compact to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to
4 the convening of the Regular Session of 2018; and

5

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report shall include:

7

8 (1) The number of college students from the Philippines
9 and Hawaii participating in the student exchange
10 program since its inception, pursuant to the Compact;

11

12 (2) An assessment of the effectiveness of the Compact; and

13

14 (3) Any recommendations or proposed legislation that the
15 Dean of the University of Hawaii School of Travel
16 Industry Management and the Chancellors from
17 University of Hawaii West Oahu and participating
18 University of Hawaii community colleges deem necessary
19 to improve the Compact; and

20

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
22 Resolution be transmitted to the Dean of the School of Travel
23 Industry Management, University of Hawaii; Chancellor of
24 University of Hawaii West Oahu; Chancellor of University of
25 Hawaii, Hawaii Community College; Chancellor of University of
26 Hawaii, Kapiolani Community College; Chancellor of University of
27 Hawaii, Kauai Community College; Chancellor of University of
28 Hawaii, Maui College; Governor of the Province of Ilocos Sur;
29 President of the University of Northern Philippines; and
30 Administrator of Ilocos Sur Community College.
