entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE REPEAL OF SECTION 325-15,  
HAWAII REVISED STATUTES,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose of this measure is to repeal the obsolete  
statutory requirement that United States citizens and nationals  
returning to Hawaii after at least five years residence abroad in  
a region with a high rate of communicable disease submit to a  
medical examination to screen for tuberculosis.

The Department of Health testified in support of this  
measure.

Your Committee has amended this measure by:

- (1) Changing its effective date to July 1, 2030, to  
facilitate further discussion; and
- (2) Making technical, nonsubstantive amendments for clarity,  
consistency, and style.


