<u>HB 1120</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SPECIAL SHORELINE ENCROACHMENT EASEMENTS. Provides the Board of Land and Natural Resources discretion to grant easements for less than fair market value for structures that were authorized by a governmental authority and located landward of the shoreline within the record boundary of the property at the time of construction, but are now located seaward of the valid certified shoreline on public land. <u>HB 1542</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIAN HIGHER EDUCATION. Establishes an undergraduate health sciences academy at the University of Hawaii to increase recruitment and retention of Native Hawaiian, Pacific Islander, and first generation college students. Makes an appropriation.	OMH, HED, FIN
<u>HB 1094</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PERSONAL PRIVACY. Specifies certain content of Department of Hawaiian Home Lands homestead applicant and lessee files are not required to be disclosed.	OMH, JUD
<u>HB 1095</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION. Amends the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act to reduce the number of commissioners that are residents of the city and county of Honolulu and adds a commissioner from the island of Lanai.	OMH, JUD
<u>HB 65</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE REDEVELOPMENT OF THE BOWL-O-DROME PROPERTY. Authorizes general obligation bonds and appropriates funds to the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands for the redevelopment of the Bowl-O-Drome property, located at 820 Isenberg Street, with the assistance of the Hawaii Community Development Authority. RELATING TO AQUATIC LIFE.
Requires the Division of Aquatic Resources to promote education about nearshore reef wildlife and to develop a comprehensive plan, programs, and policies for its sustainable management.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
