(HSCR514)  
Status

RELATING TO DENTISTRY.  
Requires dentists who administer general anesthesia, deep sedation, or moderate (conscious) sedation to post notice of contact information for verification of the dentist's licensure to administer anesthesia and sedation. Requires inspection of a dentist's facilities, equipment, and staffing as a condition of licensure to administer anesthesia or sedation. (HB561 HD1)

HB 563, HD1  
(HSCR579)

RELATING TO DENTAL HYGIENISTS.  
Permits licensed dental hygienists in the State to operate under general, rather than direct, supervision of a licensed dentist in specified circumstances that protect patient health and safety. (HB563 HD1)

RELATING TO INFRASTRUCTURE.  
Establishes the siting process of infrastructure for small wireless or wireline facilities and small wireless or wireline facilities networks on state- and county-owned land. (HB625 HD2)

HB 790, HD1  
(HSCR470)  
Status

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.  
Establishes disclosure and public notification requirements for outdoor application of restricted use pesticides in various sensitive areas or by large-scale, outdoor commercial agricultural operations. (HB790 HD1)

EEL/AGR, CPC

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
