<u>SB 185, SD2, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1167)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CHILD CARE PROVIDERS. Beginning January 1, 2019, requires child care providers licensed or registered by the Department of Human Services to obtain and maintain liability insurance coverage. (SB185 HD1)	HUS, CPC
<u>SB 609, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1198)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ATTESTATION ENGAGEMENTS. Requires that peer reviews performed on public accounting firms are performed in accordance with the entirety of the Statements on Standards for Attestation Engagements adopted by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. (SB609 HD1)	IAC, CPC
<u>SB 1264, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR704)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SECURITY GUARDS. Streamlines the application and renewal process for security guards by: allowing for self-attestation of the educational requirement; reducing the number of hours of instruction for initial licensure; reducing the frequency of the four-hour continuing education requirement to every other renewal period; and authorizing alternative formats of continuing education instruction. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	IAC, CPC
<u>SB 371, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR604)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE BOARD OF DENTISTRY AND DENTAL HYGIENE. Changes the name of the Board of Dental Examiners to the Board of Dentistry and Dental Hygiene. Beginning on 7/1/2018, changes the board composition by increasing dental hygienist representation and ensuring Oahu and neighbor island representation among dental hygienist members. <u>SB 505, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR565)</u> <u>Status</u>	<p>RELATING TO HEALTH.</p> <p>Requires an opioid therapy informed consent process agreement to be executed between a patient and any prescriber of opioids within the State under certain conditions. Requires the harm reduction services branch of the department of health to develop and make available a template of an opioid therapy informed consent process agreement for use in the State. Specifies the contents of the template. Requires all opioid therapy informed consent process agreements to be filed with the harm reduction services branch of the department of health for monitoring. Establishes that prescribers who violate the mandatory opioid therapy informed consent process shall be subject to disciplinary action established by the Hawaii Medical Board or the State Board of Nursing. Requires all prescribers who are authorized to prescribe opioids to register with Hawaii's electronic prescription accountability system. Limits initial prescriptions for opioids and benzodiazepines to a maximum of seven consecutive days with certain exceptions. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)</p>	HLT, CPC
<u>SB 513, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1160)</u> <u>Status</u>	<p>RELATING TO CONTRACEPTIVE SUPPLIES.</p> <p>Authorizes pharmacists to prescribe and dispense self-administered hormonal contraceptive supplies to patients regardless of a previous prescription, subject to specified education and procedural requirements. Authorizes insurance reimbursement to pharmacists. (SB513 HD1)</p>	HLT, CPC
<u>SB 514, SD1</u> <u>(HSCR1101)</u> <u>Status</u>	<p>RELATING TO HEALTH.</p> <p>Authorizes pharmacists to administer the human papillomavirus, Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis), meningococcal, or influenza vaccine to persons between eleven and seventeen years of age. Specifies requirements pharmacists must meet prior to administering the human papillomavirus, Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis), meningococcal, or influenza vaccine. (SD1)</p>	HLT, CPC
<u>SB 119, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR726)</u> <u>Status</u>	<p>RELATING TO PAYMENT OF RENT.</p> <p>Requires landlords to disclose in writing the tenant's ability to establish a new due date for rent payment if the tenant receives public assistance. Establishes a cap of five per cent on late rent payment fees, applicable to all new rental agreements and rental agreement renewals entered into on or after the effective date of this measure. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)</p>	CPC
<u>SB 584, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1150)</u> <u>Status</u>	<p>RELATING TO MORTGAGES.</p> <p>Allows an extended or hanai family member to act as a co-mortgagor in assisting a qualified resident in securing a mortgage to purchase a dwelling unit from the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation. (SB584 HD1)</p>	HSG, CPC
<u>SB 611, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1149)</u> <u>Status</u>	<p>RELATING TO FIRE SPRINKLERS.</p> <p>Extends the prohibition on county requirements for automatic sprinklers or sprinkler systems in one- and two-family detached dwelling units and non-residential agricultural and aquacultural structures located outside urban areas. (SB611 HD1)</p>	HSG, CPC

RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS.

Clarifies that if a proxy is a standard proxy form authorized by an association, and the proxy is returned with no box checked or more than one box checked, the proxy shall be counted for quorum purposes only. (SB392 HD1)

RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS.

CPC

Clarifies that any violation of a mandatory provision of the State's condominium law by a condominium board of directors or its officers and members is a per se violation of the board's fiduciary duty, but providing a safe harbor provision for a board member who votes for compliance during a board meeting. Balances the right of association members to speak and participate in deliberations and discussions of a board, while ensuring that a board is able to complete its agenda in a timely manner. Requires the notice for board meetings to include a list of items expected to be on the meeting agenda. Requires unapproved final drafts of the minutes of a board meeting to be available within fourteen days after the meeting. (SD1)

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.
