SB 372, SD1
(SSCR698)
Status

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE INSURANCE.
Requires motor vehicle insurers to make satisfactory arrangements with the insurance commissioner to handle claims and service policies within the State. Specifies that motor vehicle insurers are required to maintain at least one physical sales and claims service office in each county. Requires the insurance commissioner to submit a report to the legislature, each year for five years, regarding any consumer complaints received as a result of changing the requirements for motor vehicle insurers to maintain a field presence in Hawaii. Takes effect on 7/1/2050. Repeals on 6/30/2022. (SD1)

RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION PHYSICIAN.
Amends the definition of "physician" in Workers' Compensation Law to include advanced practice registered nurses. (SB984 HD1)

Status

RELATING TO CONTRACTORS.
Requires any person applying for a license as an electrical contractor or electronic systems contractor to possess a trade license or an electrical engineering degree from an accredited college to perform electrical work in the State. Exempts public utilities and community antennae television companies. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

Status

RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY.
Establishes a broadband task force to create a statewide broadband plan. (SB1201 HD1)

Status

RELATING TO THE INTERISLAND TRANSMISSION SYSTEM.
Repeals chapter 269, part VIII, Hawaii Revised Statutes, relating to the interisland transmission system. (SB376 HD1)

(HSCR1343)
Status

RELATING TO PRESERVING CORAL REEFS.
Prohibits use and sale of nonprescription sunscreen, sunblock, or cosmetics containing oxybenzone or other chemicals deemed harmful to coral reefs by the Department of Land and Natural Resources within a marine life conservation district. Requires commercial permittees to inform all customers of the prohibition. Authorizes Department of Land and Natural Resources to propose rules for other areas to conserve state marine resources. (SB1150 HD2)

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:

PAPER: 20 copies (including an original) to Room 327 in the State Capitol;

FAX: For testimony less than 5 pages in length, transmit to 808-586-6221 (Oahu) or 1-800-535-3859 (for Neighbor Islander without a computer to submit testimony through e-mail or the Web); or
