Repeals the Emergency Medical Services Special Fund and appropriates an equal amount of general funds to the Department of Health for emergency medical services. Establishes a pilot program and authorizes TAT expenditure for county regulation and operation of ambulance services. Establishes and appropriates funds for a community paramedic pilot program. <p>HB 554, HD1 (HSCR806) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO ORDERS FOR TREATMENT OVER OBJECTION. Authorizes psychiatric treatment by administrative order despite a patient's objection. Establishes criteria for administering psychiatric treatment and the process to obtain administrative authorization for psychiatric treatment over the patient's objection. <p>HB 558, HD1 (HSCR1003) Status & Testimony</p>	<p>RELATING TO THE REPEAL OF SECTION 325-15, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES.
