<u>HB 848</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY MODERNIZATION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII SYSTEM. Exempt microgrids that promote and serve public higher education institutions from regulation as a public utility by the Public Utilities Commission. Adds a definition for "microgrid".	EEP, HED, FIN
<u>HB 792</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ELECTRICITY GENERATION. Makes the use of customer self-supply facilities economically viable by requiring the Public Utilities Commission to develop standards and requirements to expedite the interconnection of qualifying customer self-supply facilities and allowing qualifying customers to select an applicable rate schedule.	EEP, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 1593</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE. Establishes the clean energy savings jump start program and fund. Establishes the energy storage system rebate program. Amends the green infrastructure loan program by deleting the public utilities commission's loan approval authority.	EEP, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 957</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEAT ABATEMENT. Authorizes the DOE and B&F to borrow moneys from the Hawaii green infrastructure loan program for heat abatement measures at public schools. Appropriates general funds to make an initial repayment to the Hawaii green infrastructure special fund.	EEP, EDN, FIN



DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
