HB 1105
Status

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.
Repeals the Emergency Medical Services Special Fund and deposits moneys from the fund's revenue sources into the general fund, and appropriates an equivalent amount of general funds for the Department of Health.

HB 1313
Status

RELATING TO HEALTH.
Appropriates funds for the purchase and operational costs of one ambulance unit for the Honolulu Emergency Medical Services division of the City and County of Honolulu Department of Emergency Services for use in Ewa Beach. Appropriates additional funds for rent and other associated costs for an emergency medical services station in Ewa Beach.

HB 1410
Status

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.
Transfers the regulation of ambulance services from the DOH to the counties. Allocates a portion of the transient accommodations tax to the counties for ambulance regulation and operation. Effective 7/1/2017.

<u>HB 1108</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS. Limits the exemption from payment of parking meter fees to vehicles that display a distinguishing parking permit or decal issued to an applicant who presents a certificate of disability that verifies that the applicant is licensed to drive a motor vehicle and cannot reach or operate a parking meter because of a physical disability.	HLT/HUS, TRN, FIN
<u>HB 1109</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS. Clarifies the authority of law enforcement officers or commissioned volunteer enforcement officers to confiscate disability parking permits that are used unlawfully.	HLT/HUS, JUD
<u>HB 1110</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TIER II FILING FEES FOR REPORTING OF HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES. Changes the Hawaii Emergency Planning and Community Right-To-Know Act, Tier II filing fee from \$100 to \$200 to provide needed preparedness resources to Local Area Planning Committees.	HLT, PBS, FIN

<u>HB 322</u> <u>Status</u>	MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES. Appropriates moneys to DOH for FY 2017-2018 to purchase an ambulance vehicle and for the costs of operating a 24-hour, 7-days-a-week, ambulance unit for the County of Kauai.	HLT, FIN
<u>HB 313</u> <u>Status</u>	MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES. Appropriates funds for one ambulance unit each for the County of Kauai and the County of Hawaii, including equipment, supplies, and personnel costs.	HLT, FIN
<u>HB 603</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Appropriates funds for 1 advanced life support ambulance to be based in Makalei on the island of Hawaii and to be used from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., and to include a vehicle, equipment, and personnel costs.	HLT, FIN
<u>HB 837</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Makes an appropriation for one advanced life support ambulance to be based in Puna on the island of Hawaii and to be used from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., and to include a vehicle, equipment, and personnel costs.	HLT, FIN
<u>HB 216</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO COMMUNITY PARAMEDIC SERVICES. Implements the recommendations of the working group convened pursuant to House Concurrent Resolution No. 90, Regular Session of 2016, by establishing and appropriating funds for a three-year community paramedic services pilot program. Requires a report to the Legislature before the Regular Session of 2021.	HLT, FIN



<u>HB 913</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MEDICAL COVERAGE FOR FIREFIGHTERS. Improves access for firefighters to comprehensive medical coverage and service-connected disability retirement benefits for hazardous duty related diseases that are presumed to arise out of and in the course of employment.	HLT, LAB, FIN
<u>HB 467</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING IN PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT. Creates 7 separate collective bargaining units for employees of the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation.	HLT, LAB, FIN
<u>HB 468</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING IN PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT. Establishes collective bargaining unit (15) for employees with the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation.	HLT, LAB, FIN
<u>HB 469</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION. Authorizes the Hawaii health systems corporation to enter into a contract for the privatization of food services at Hawaii health systems corporation facilities.	HLT, LAB, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
