RELATING TO LABOR. LAB, FIN HB 409 Authorizes the Director of Labor and Industrial Relations or the Status Director's designee to issue a stop-work order to an employer,

until the employer complies with Chapter 388, Hawaii Revised Statutes, relating to the payment of wages and other compensation.
