<u>HB 440</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Prohibits government contracts to develop or house inmates in out-of-state private correctional facilities. Clarifies that the State may contract with federal, state, and municipal governments to house inmates and develop correctional facilities.	PBS, JUD, FIN
<u>HB 845</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO IDENTIFICATION. Requires the Department of Public Safety in collaboration with county and state agencies to issue civil identification cards to inmates and to assist inmates in obtaining their birth certificate, social security card, and other relevant identification necessary for successful reentry.	PBS, JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1133</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PAROLE. Specifies that funds for discharged persons be subject to legislative appropriation. Clarifies circumstances under which the Hawaii Paroling Authority may grant early discharges. Provides the paroling authority with discretion when considering pardons for paroled prisoners and clarifies early discharge consideration of paroled prisoners is an administrative action, not an in-person hearing before the authority. <u>HB 1246</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ALTERNATIVES TO INCARCERATION. Expands the authority of DPS to release certain pre-trial detainees and sentenced offenders to include felons. Requires electronic monitoring of released detainees and offenders. Authorizes electronic monitoring of offenders in programs that offer alternatives to incarceration. Appropriates funds. Status

RELATING TO WATER.

PBS, WAL, FIN

Requires the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency to develop a post-disaster fresh drinking water security plan. Makes an appropriation. Requires a report to legislature prior to the regular session of 2018.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:

PAPER: 10 copies (including an original) to Room 328 in the State Capitol;



Testimony submitted will be placed on the legislative website. This public posting of testimony on the website should be considered when including personal information in your testimony. **Those wishing to provide oral testimony will be limited to three minutes.**
