

Assistant Program Administrator for the Program Development office of Child Welfare Services. Duties include provision of administrative direction in planning, development, implementation, control, monitoring and evaluation of child welfare services authorized under federal and state statutes provided by the Department. In addition, this position also provides coverage on other child welfare service program areas including Mental Health, Substance Abuse, Homelessness and Psychiatric Medications as these pertain to children in foster care.

Department Manager
 Sound Mental Health – Seattle, WA

MA/MHP level supervisor responsible for directly overseeing program employees in Homeless Services. Carries out supervisory responsibilities in accordance with the organization's policies and applicable laws. Responsibilities include clinical supervision, interviewing, hiring, and training employees; planning, assigning, and directing work; appraising performance; rewarding and disciplining employees; addressing complaints and resolving problems. Oversees programs for the Homeless, including Housing First for chronically homeless mentally ill or co-occurring clients, Housing First model program for homeless families with high needs including mental health services, PATH outreach program servicing mentally ill chronically homeless individuals and families in south and east King County with federal funding as well as county and city participation.



Assist in the development and supervision of Homeless Services. In addition to supervision of project staff, the coordinator functions as part of the team, providing housing search, housing case management/ housing stabilization services, and mental health/chemical dependency treatment to families and individuals who are homeless, mentally ill, substance abusing or chemically dependent and multi-system involved. Homeless services are designed to serve high needs homeless individuals and families with a housing first model that includes permanent housing. Homeless Services includes South King County Housing First, PATH, Project Homestead and outreach to the homeless contracts.

Lead Clinician Housing First
 Sound Mental Health – Seattle, WA

Provide leadership, support and functional administrative supervision to assigned site. Continue primary functions of the Clinician/Case Manager role for assigned caseload. This position works with adult clients with a dual diagnosis of a mental illness and chemical dependency and assists them in becoming as independent as possible in the community. Through the provision of a full range of clinical roles, case management services, and service coordination, the Lead clinician assists clients in setting and attaining short and long term goals. The Lead Clinician also serves as a resource for, and provides leadership and example to, other team members.

Case Manager Housing First
 Sound Mental Health – Seattle, WA

The Housing First Case Manager works with adult clients who have a mental illness, chemical dependency and co-occurring disorders. The Case Manager assists clients in becoming as independent as possible in the community. Through the provision of a full range of case management services and service coordination, the Housing First Case Manager assists clients in setting and attaining short and long term goals. The Housing First Case Manager also serves as a resource for, and provides leadership to, other team members.

Original team member of Access to Recovery program as part of a community mental health agency.
