

**Kenneth B. Robbins, MD, EVP & Chief Medical Officer - Hawai'i Pacific Health.**

Kenneth B. Robbins, M.D., has been Chief Medical Officer and Executive Vice President of Hawai'i Pacific Health since 2002. From 2001 through 2010 he also held the position of Chief Medical Officer for Straub Clinic & Hospital. Dr. Robbins holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology from Stanford University and received his Doctor of Medicine from the University of California, San Diego, School of Medicine in 1979. He completed his pediatric residency program at Kapi'olani Medical Center for Women & Children in 1982. Dr. Robbins served as a Captain and staff pediatrician in the U.S. Army, Medical Service Corps. In 1982, he was stationed in Stuttgart, West Germany, where he was the Acting Director of the Exceptional Family Member Program and a recipient of the Army Commendation Award for meritorious service. He returned to Hawaii in 1984, joining the academic faculty at Kapiolani Medical Center for Women & Children. The following year he joined Straub as a practicing pediatrician, where he practiced pediatrics for over 20 years.

Dr. Robbins began his administrative career in 1997 by serving as a member of the Straub Board of Directors. He later served as Treasurer and then President of the Board of Directors at Straub during the years leading up to the merger with Hawai'i Pacific Health, which occurred in December, 2001. As Chief Medical Officer of Hawai'i Pacific Health, Dr. Robbins is responsible for physician recruitment, physician leadership development, and the physician compensation plans for the HPH Medical Group. He provides oversight to the Chief Medical Officers and Chief Executive Officers of the hospitals and medical groups within Hawai'i Pacific Health on physician-related issues.

Dr. Robbins is board certified in Pediatrics, a Fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics, and a Clinical Professor in the Department of Pediatrics at the John A. Burns School of Medicine at the University of Hawai'i. He is also a member of the American Medical Group Association, Medical Group Management Association, and the American Association of Physician Leadership.
