RELATING TO FIREARMS. JUD HB1176

> Clarifies that failure to register a firearm within the required time period does not relieve the owner of the duty to register the firearm. Allows the owner of an unregistered firearm to register

the firearm thereafter without penalty.

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. PBS, JUD, FIN HB1177

> Requires PSD to work with the Social Security Administration to enter into an agreement to obtain replacement social security cards for inmates. Requires PSD, in conjunction with DOH, DOT, and the examiner of drivers of each county, to provide Hawaii-born inmates with copies of birth certificates and driver's licenses or state ID cards. Requires PSD to assist inmates born outside of Hawaii to obtain birth certificates and

photo IDs.

HB1178 RELATING TO SEPARATION BENEFITS. LAB, FIN

> Appropriates funds for severance benefits and special retirement benefits for public employees affected by the privatization or closure of Hawaii health systems corporation facilities.

RELATING TO HOUSING. HB1179 HSG, LAB, FIN

> Expands the types of rental housing projects that can be exempted from general excise taxes. Allows the terms of collective bargaining agreements and associated provisions to be deemed the prevailing wages and terms serving as the basis of compliance with chapter 104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for the

construction of certain rental housing projects.

HB1180 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. LAB, CPC

> Amends the definition of contractor in Chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, relating to the Hawaii Procurement Code. Applies procurement sanctions to subcontractors for unethical

violations.

#### HB1187 RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

JUD, FIN

Beginning with the primary election in 2018, requires the office of elections to implement election by mail in a county with a population of fewer than 100,000 and beginning with the 2020 primary election, implement election by mail in each of the other counties for all elections. Establishes an election by mail system, including requirements for ballots, replacement ballots, deficient return of ballots, electronic transmission of replacement ballots under certain circumstances, ballot counting, voter service centers, places of deposit, and election expenses and responsibilities. Establishes procedures for postponed elections. Makes conforming amendments to provide for an election by mail system. Allows voters in an election by mail system to request that their ballots be temporarily forwarded to another address in or outside of the State for a single election or a primary or special primary election and the election immediately following it. Appropriates funds for the implementation and administration of the elections by mail program. Requires the office of elections to submit annual reports to the legislature from 2018 to 2024 regarding implementing the elections by mail program.

#### HB1188 RELATING TO VOTING.

TRN, JUD

Specifies that an affidavit on application for voter registration shall be a part of the application associated with the issuance of a civil identification card and driver's license. Requires each county examiner of drivers to electronically store the contents of the affidavit on application for voter registration provided by applicants in conjunction with their driver's license and civil identification card applications and provide electronic accessibility of this information. Effective 1/1/2018.

#### HB1189 RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE.

JUD, FIN

Establishes an exemption from the prohibition against using election campaign funds to make charitable donations or to award scholarships during the period from the filing of nomination papers to the date of the general election, for candidates who are already declared elected to office after running unopposed in an election.

## <u>HB1190</u> PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE V, SECTION JUD, FIN

6, OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII. Proposes an amendment to article V, section 6, of the Hawaii State Constitution to provide that the attorney general be elected as a nonpartisan elected official rather than appointed by the governor.

#### REFERRAL HB1191 RELATING TO BEACHES. OMH/EEP, WAL Amends the definition of "water pollutant" as used in chapter 342D, HRS, to exclude locally sourced sand that meets certain conditions. Amends fines for the destroying or harvesting of koa trees and other trees and plants on state lands to an amount up to the current market value of each tree or plant at that location and the cost of restoration or replacement of the habitat. Clarifies that any person that violates a provision of part II of chapter 183, HRS (forest reserves), or any rule adopted pursuant thereto, other than section 183-17, HRS, shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor. Repeals the general penalty provision of chapter 183, HRS. RELATING TO IMPORTANT AGRICULTURAL LANDS. WAL, FIN HB1193 Appropriates funds for grants-in-aid to the counties for assistance with identifying and mapping important agricultural lands. HB1194 RELATING TO EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES. EDN, FIN Allows home schooled students to participate in extracurricular activities offered at the public school that they would otherwise be required to attend. RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS. HB1195 HUS/HLT, FIN Appropriates funds to DOH and DHS, including the office of youth services, to provide homeless outreach services. HB1196 RELATING TO HOUSING. HSG/HUS, FIN Appropriates funds to DHS for the housing first program and the rapid re-housing program to assist chronically homeless individuals and individuals who require financial assistance to avoid homelessness. Appropriates funds to the Hawaii Public Housing Authority for the state rent supplement program to assist homeless individuals or families and those at imminent risk of homelessness. RELATING TO EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS. HB1197 PBS, FIN Appropriates moneys necessary to supply emergency 7-day provisions of food and water for state and county firefighters while they serve at fire stations; provided that a county provides matching funds for provisions for its firefighters.

RELATING TO ELECTIONS. JUD HB1238 Provides that a candidate committee shall not be required to file a statement of information for electioneering communications made by a candidate committee that clearly identifies the communication as being paid for by the candidate committee. Repeals the requirement that a candidate committee file a statement of information of the names and addresses of all persons who contributed to the committee or the organization for the purpose of publishing or broadcasting the electioneering communications. HB1239 RELATING TO MARRIAGE. JUD Provides that common law marriages shall be lawfully recognized, subject to certain conditions. RELATING TO APPROPRIATIONS TO ADDRESS HB1240 HSG/HUS, FIN HOMELESSNESS. Appropriates funds to DHS for the coordinated statewide homeless initiative, subject to certain conditions. RELATING TO MORTGAGE SERVICERS. CPC, JUD HB1241 Exempts nonprofit organizations and their employees who are already exempt from licensure and registration as mortgage loan originators from regulation as mortgage loan servicers.

### <u>HB1242</u> RELATING TO TAXATION.

TOU/HSG, FIN

Ensures that property that is used for short-term rental transient accommodations in the State is subject to and in compliance with applicable State and county laws.

# HB1243 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES.

WAL, FIN

Requires the department of land and natural resources to develop a department telephone hotline intake training program to enable the department to efficiently and effectively receive information and respond to information and reports relating to the department's duties and responsibilities. Appropriates funds to the department of land and natural resources to establish one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) permanent civil service position to provide intake services for the department of land and natural resources' telephone hotline twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week.

#### HB1244 RELATING TO CESSPOOLS.

HLT/EEP, FIN

Amends the cesspool upgrade, conversion, or connection income tax credit to: (1) make the tax credit assignable; (2) make the tax credit refundable; (3) disallow the tax credit for taxpayers whose federal adjusted gross income exceeds certain amounts; (4) expand the criteria for cesspools that qualify for the tax credit; and (5) extend the sunset date to 12/31/2022. Requires that all cesspools in the State be upgraded or converted to septic or aerobic treatment unit systems or connected to sewer systems. Establishes a grant program to assist with cesspool upgrade or conversion costs. Appropriates funds for the grant program. Requires DOH to develop guidelines for the mandatory disclosure of cesspools on real property.

#### HB1245 RELATING TO CEMETERIES.

WAL, CPC, FIN

Requires DCCA in consultation with Comptroller to develop strategies for repair and maintenance of Sunset Memorial Park in Pearl City, Oahu. Authorizes DCCA to access the Sunset Memorial Trust Fund. Provides limited liability for persons maintaining or repairing cemetery grounds. Requires report to Legislature.

#### HB1246 RELATING TO ALTERNATIVES TO INCARCERATION.

PBS, JUD, FIN
