#### SB2, SD2 RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

HUS, FIN

Requires the auditor to conduct a study to assess the impact of using medicaid funds to provide coverage for the treatment for homelessness. Requires the auditor to submit a report to the legislature. Makes an appropriation. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

#### SB7, SD2 RELATING TO MEDICAID.

HLT/HUS, FIN

Requires the department of human services, in collaboration with the department of health, to review the progress of the Hawaii pathways project pilot and continue to pursue efforts to utilize medicaid to provide supportive housing services for chronically homeless individuals. Provides considerations for the department in planning for the expansion of supportive housing services provided through medicaid managed care plans. Requires the department to report to the legislature. Makes an appropriation. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

#### SB21, SD2 RELATING TO CHILD CARE.

HUS, JUD

JUD, FIN

Increases monetary penalties for violating the laws relating to child care facilities. Authorizes the department of human services to refer to the attorney general or respective county prosecutor any intentional, knowing, or reckless violation of the laws relating to child care facilities or certain criminal offenses. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD2)

## SB26, SD1 MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE OFFICE OF THE

PROSECUTING ATTORNEY FOR HAWAII COUNTY. Appropriates funds as a grant-in-aid to the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney for Hawaii County Career Criminal

Prosecution Unit. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

### SB27, SD1 MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO RESTORE BASIC HUS, FIN

ADULT DENTAL BENEFITS TO MEDICAID ENROLLEES. Makes an appropriation to the department of human services to restore basic adult dental benefits to Medicaid enrollees. Requires the department of human services to obtain the maximum federal matching funds available for this expenditure.

Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

#### SB98, SD1 RELATING TO COURTS.

JUD, FIN

Raises the district courts' jurisdictional limit for civil actions involving specific performance. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD1)

SB99, SD1

## RELATING TO THE HOUSING CHOICE VOUCHER PROGRAM.

HSG, FIN

Prohibits any county from disqualifying a legal nonconforming dwelling unit from the housing choice voucher program if the unit meets zoning and building code requirements and other program standards such as health and safety standards. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

#### SB100, SD2 RELATING TO TAXATION.

FIN

Delays the reviews by the Auditor of tax exemptions, exclusions, credits, and deductions. Provides the Auditor with access to DOTAX records for the reviews and authorizes the Auditor to include data from the records in its reports to the legislature that do not explicitly identify any specific taxpayer. Adds the organic foods production income tax credit to the schedule of review. Amends the review criteria regarding the legislative purpose of an exemption, exclusion, credit, or deduction to provide more discretion to the Auditor. Appropriates funds to the Auditor for fiscal year 2018-2019; requires report to legislature. Effective 7/1/2018. (SD2)

**SB102** RELATING TO THE FEDERAL FUNDING POLICY STUDY. Changes the agency responsible for preparing the federal funding policy study required under Act 225, Session Laws of Hawaii 2016, from the Office of the Governor to B&F. Makes an appropriation. RELATING TO THE DISPOSITION OF EXCESS GENERAL FIN SB103, SD2 FUNDS AUTHORIZED UNDER ARTICLE VII. SECTION 6. OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII. Implements the state constitutional amendment of Senate Bill No. 2554 of the Regular Session of 2016 that authorizes the disposition of excess general fund revenues to pre-pay general obligation bond debt service or pension or other postemployment benefit liabilities. Takes effect 6/30/2017. (SD2) RELATING TO CONDOMINIUM GOVERNING **CPC** SB104, SD1 INSTRUMENTS. Clarifies the procedures to amend condominium association declarations, bylaws, and other governing instruments that are not of a material adverse nature to condominium owners or do not imperil the viability or stability of the condominium association. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1) SB110, SD2 RELATING TO AQUATIC RESOURCES. OMH/WAL, FIN Authorizes the Department of Land and Natural Resources to use in-lieu fee mitigation to restore, create, enhance, or preserve aquatic habitats or resources as compensatory mitigation. (SD2) SB111, SD1 RELATING TO VOTING. JUD Provides that the ballot of an absentee or military-overseas voter is valid even if the voter becomes ineligible to vote after casting the ballot. Repeals the requirement that an absentee voter's ballot be deemed invalid if the voter returns the return envelope but dies prior to the opening of polls. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD1) SB119, SD1 RELATING TO PAYMENT OF RENT. **CPC** Requires landlords to disclose in writing the tenant's ability to establish a new due date for rent payment if the tenant receives public assistance. Establishes a cap of five per cent on late rent payment fees, applicable to all new rental agreements and rental agreement renewals entered into on or after the effective date of this measure. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

#### SB122, SD2 RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

HLT, JUD

Entitles designated family members and other interested persons of a person having a mental health emergency to: notice of emergency admission, examination, and hospitalization. Entitles designated family members and other interested persons to the option to be present in the courtroom for a hearing on a petition for involuntary hospitalization or assisted community treatment and the option to receive copies of hearing transcripts or recordings, unless the court determines that the interests of justice require otherwise. Requires notice of discharge and voluntary inpatient treatment when forensic and non-forensic patients are civilly committed to individuals specified in the order of commitment. Requires the court to adjourn or continue a hearing on a petition for involuntary hospitalization or assisted community treatment for failure to timely notify designated persons, with certain exceptions. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD2)

#### SB133, SD2

#### RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' FRINGE BENEFITS.

Requires the EUTF's actuary to prepare a valuation report annually. Requires the annual valuation to include an update of assumptions specific to the fund that are not updated pursuant to section 88-105, HRS, as deemed necessary by the actuary at least once in each three-year period. Reduces the maximum period between experience studies of the ERS from five years to three years. Effective 1/7/2059. (SD2)

#### SB134, SD1

#### RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

HLT/HED, LAB

LAB, FIN

Prohibits smoking and tobacco use, including the use of electronic smoking devices, by any person on the premises of the University of Hawaii. Takes effect 1/7/2059. (SD1)

#### SB137, SD2

#### RELATING TO UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII RESEARCH.

HED, JUD, FIN

HED, FIN

Establishes the Innovation and Commercialization Initiative Program to expressly give the University of Hawaii the legal authority to create, finance, and participate in new economic enterprises and expand workforce opportunities based on inventions and discoveries generated by or at the University. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD2)

#### SB141, SD2

#### RELATING TO PHYSICIAN WORKFORCE ASSESSMENT.

Allows the John A. Burns School of Medicine to continue receiving revenues from the physician workforce assessment fee until June 30, 2022, for ongoing physician workforce assessment and planning to support the recruitment and retention of physicians in the State, particularly those in rural and medically underserved areas. Takes effect 3/9/2092. (SD2)

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## SB145, SD1 RELATING TO EXAMINATIONS OF FITNESS TO PROCEED.

HLT/PBS, JUD

Clarifies provisions regarding examinations of defendants' fitness to proceed in the prosecution. Authorizes the department of health and department of public safety to enter into an agreement concerning the transfer of detainees in a community correctional center. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

## SB146, SD2 RELATING TO ORDERS FOR TREATMENT OVER OBJECTION.

HLT, JUD

Permits an administrative order to overcome a patient's objection to medical treatment. Establishes criteria for medical treatment over objection and the administrative authorization process for administratively ordering medical treatment over objection. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

#### SB150, SD1 RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

JUD

Requires candidates for president and vice president of the United States to post their most recent income tax return on the Internet at least sixty days prior to and continuing through the date of the general election for free access by the public in order to be included on the state ballot, subject to certain conditions. Prohibits electors from voting for a candidate for president or vice president of the United States unless both candidates have posted their most recent income tax return on the Internet at least sixty days prior to and continuing through the date of the general election for free access by the public, subject to certain conditions. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD1)

#### SB151, SD1 RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS.

**CPC** 

Enables condominium associations to adopt rules and regulations that: require unit owners to prohibit smoking inside a condominium unit as part of a lease agreement; and prohibit smoking on a lanai of a condominium unit and in all common elements. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD1)

#### SB174, SD2 RELATING TO MEDICAL MARIJUANA.

HLT, JUD

Amends the definition of debilitating medical condition to include lupus, epilepsy, multiple sclerosis, arthritis, and autism as conditions that qualify for the legal use of medical marijuana. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD2)

#### SB185, SD2 RELATING TO CHILD CARE PROVIDERS.

HUS, CPC

Beginning January 1, 2019, requires child care providers licensed or registered by the department of human services to obtain and maintain liability insurance coverage. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD2)

#### SB194 RELATING TO TUBERCULOSIS TESTING.

HLT, EDN

Requires the department of health to accept FDA-approved, CDC-recommended tuberculosis (TB) blood tests in addition to the TB skin test for the purpose of obtaining a certificate of TB examination. Amends the law requiring tuberculosis clearance prior to public school entry to be in accordance with law in addition to department of health rules. Clarifies that the department of health's administrative rules regarding the use of the Mantoux tuberculin skin test or chest x-rays in obtaining a certificate of tuberculosis examination shall remain in effect until amended to include the addition of TB blood tests as an acceptable TB diagnostic.

## SB195, SD1 RELATING TO THE HAWAII TEACHER STANDARDS

EDN, FIN

Appropriates moneys from the general fund for two specialist II positions within the Hawaii teacher standards board. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD1)

#### SB197, SD1 RELATING TO CHARTER SCHOOLS.

EDN, FIN

Appropriates moneys for start-up grants for newly approved, preopening public charter schools. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

#### SB199, SD1 RELATING TO TEACHER INCENTIVES.

EDN, FIN

Clarifies that funds for bonuses required by statute or collective bargaining shall not be paid out of a charter school's facilities funding or per-pupil funds. Requires, beginning with fiscal year 2018-2019, that such bonuses be separate line items in the budget. Appropriates funds for teacher bonuses for hard-to-fill placement incentives and National Board certified teacher incentives for charter school teachers. Takes effect on 7/1/2050. (SD1)

#### SB207, SD2 RELATING TO EMPLOYEES.

LAB, JUD, FIN

Requires each state government branch to establish a shared leave program for state employees. Allows the chief executive of a county to establish a shared leave program for county employees. Precludes a state government branch from prohibiting leave sharing between different departments or bargaining units because of administrative infeasibility. Allows an employee's designation of beneficiary form to be filed with the department where the employee is employed and permits the designation to be made through a statement that is not verified or written, including through an electronically maintained statement. Effective 1/7/2059. (SD2)

SB221, SD2	RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. Establishes the photo red light imaging detector systems program. Authorizes counties to administer the program. Requires proceeds of fines to be expended in the county from which they were collected for operation of the program. Makes an appropriation. Establishes Red Light Running Committee. Effective 1/1/2041, except part II, which takes effect on 7/1/2040. (SD2)	TRN, FIN
SB223, SD2	RELATING TO NATUROPATHIC MEDICINE. Authorizes a naturopathic physician to prescribe testosterone that is consistent with naturopathic medical practice. Clarifies that narcotic drugs shall not be included within the naturopathic formulary. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD2)	HLT, JUD, FIN
SB224, SD2	RELATING TO PSYCHOLOGY. Beginning 7/1/2019, establishes licensure requirements for school psychologists to be administered by the board of psychology. Amends the composition of the board to include two school psychologists. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	EDN, IAC/CPC
<u>SB245, SD2</u>	RELATING TO GOVERNMENT RECORDS. Requires each unit of government of the State and its political subdivisions to exercise reasonable care in the maintenance of all government records under its control that are required to be made available for public inspection. Takes effect on 1/1/2019. (SD2)	JUD, FIN
SB247, SD2	RELATING TO ELECTIONS. Requires recounts of election votes when the margin of victory is less than two hundred fifty votes or less than one per cent of the votes cast, whichever is less. Takes effect on 01/07/59. (SD2)	JUD, FIN
SB249, SD2	RELATING TO RETIREMENT. Reduces the percentage of average final compensation used to calculate the retirement allowance for a member who first earned credited service as a judge after June 30, 2017, to two per cent. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	LAB, FIN
<u>SB251, SD1</u>	RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE. Establishes an exemption from the prohibition against using election campaign funds to make charitable donations or to award scholarships during the period from the filing of nomination papers to the date of the general election, for candidates who are already declared elected to office after running unopposed in an election or who would be unopposed in the general election. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD1)	JUD, FIN

SB261, SD1 RELATING TO THE STATEWIDE TRAFFIC CODE. TRN/HLT, FIN Prohibits smoking in a motor vehicle in which a person under the age of eighteen is present. Requires the department of health to report on the enforceability of this Act and coordination of related data collection activities of the respective law enforcement agencies. (SD1) RELATING TO RAT LUNGWORM DISEASE. SB272, SD2 AGR, HED, FIN Appropriates funds to the University of Hawaii at Hilo for programs, studies, and activities related to rat lungworm disease. Conditions release of the funds on the University submitting a report to the legislature with specific strategies and objectives that the University, along with the Department of Health, Department of Land and Natural Resources, Department of Agriculture, and Joint Rat Lungworm Task Force, plan to implement to further efforts to prevent and eradicate rat lungworm disease. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) SB276, SD1 RELATING TO JUDGES. JUD, FIN Increases the number of judges of the district court of the second circuit from three to four judges. Makes housekeeping amendments to laws relating to the composition of judges of the circuit courts, district courts, and family courts. (SD1) **SB283** RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. VMI, TRN Renames Mokulele highway on Maui as the Maui veterans highway. SB285, SD2 RELATING TO THE NURSING FACILITY HUS/HLT, FIN SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM.

Continues the nursing facility sustainability program for two

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#### SB286, SD1 RELATING TO CHECK CASHING.

CPC, FIN

Specifies a customer has the right to rescind a deferred deposit by returning the principal amount used to fund the deferred deposit within a specified time frame. Permits customers to convert a deferred deposit into an installment loan plan in certain circumstances and specifies requirements for the installment loan plan. Protects against harmful collection practices. Defines annual percentage rate. Requires a check casher to post a notice informing customers that additional options may be available for safe, regulated, lower-cost, small dollar loans. Requires a check casher to provide a written agreement to a customer that clearly discloses specific information relating to the cost and fees associated with the deferred deposit, among other things. Caps the annual percentage rate at thirty-six per cent for deferred deposit of a personal check. Permits prepayment of deferred deposit agreements with no additional fees. (SD1)

#### SB287, SD1 RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE.

HLT, CPC, FIN

Requires all health insurers, including health benefits plans under chapter 87A, HRS, to disclose on, or have accessible through, their public web sites any medical policies used for making preauthorization decisions. Disclosure requirements effective 1/1/2018. (SD1)

#### SB288, SD2 RELATING TO SELF-SERVICE STORAGE FACILITIES.

CPC, JUD

Authorizes motor vehicle and boat towing options for self-service storage facilities after sixty days or more delinquency; provided that an occupant is provided notice. Requires owners to notify occupants via electronic mail or verified mail. Allows owners to send notices by electronic mail, publish notices of sales in any commercially reasonable manner, conduct sales online, and charge late fees. Authorizes limits on the liability of the owner of self-service storage facilities to be based on the maximum monetary value of property that may be stored pursuant to the rental agreement. Requires late fees to be provided for in rental agreements. Requires owners to notify occupants of the changes in the law. Effective 1/7/2059. (SD2)

#### SB292, SD1 RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS.

CPC/JUD, FIN

Repeals chapter 514A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, relating to condominium property regimes, and ensures that all condominiums in the State are governed under chapter 514B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, relating to condominiums. Effective January 1, 2019. (SD1)

#### SB298, SD1 RELATING TO SCHOOLS.

EDN/HED, FIN

Establishes a workforce readiness program within the department of education to allow students to graduate from an extended high school enrollment with a high school diploma and an industry-recognized associate's degree. Appropriates moneys to develop and implement the program. Takes effect on July 1, 2050. (SD1)

#### SB301, SD2 RELATING TO RECYCLING.

HLT/EEP, FIN

Mandates implementation of recommendations made by the office of the auditor to the department of health regarding advance disposal fee glass containers and glass recycling. Requires the department of health to report on its implementation of the recommendations to the legislature. Appropriates funds to the department of health to conduct a cost-benefit analysis of combining the glass processing streams of the advance disposal fee glass containers and deposit beverage containers. Effective 6/1/2050. (SD2)

#### SB305, SD1 RELATING TO MEDICAL MARIJUANA DISPENSARIES.

HLT, JUD

Specifies that video monitoring and recording of medical marijuana production center and retail dispensing location premises shall be retained for a period of forty-five days. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD1)

#### SB306, SD1 RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY.

CPC, JUD

Clarifies that projects that contain a combination of time share units, transient vacation rentals, and private residential units located in the same project are required to provide basic documents that will enable an owner to sell the owner's time share unit. Clarifies that an owner of a time share unit has the right to receive a list of all time share owners, including contact information, for purposes directly related to the business of a time share owners association or vacation club. Specifies that a management company of a time share owners association or vacation club board of directors must provide specific information to owners regarding candidates for election to the board of directors within thirty days prior to the election and shall not have a controlling interest on the board of directors. Clarifies that any violation of a mandatory provision of the State's condominium law by a board or its officers and members is a per se violation of the board's fiduciary duty. Provides safe harbor for a board member who votes for compliance during a board meeting. (SD1)

#### SB308, SD1 RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES.

HUS/HLT, FIN

Provides for an annual inflationary adjustment in the methodology used to reimburse facilities for the long-term care of medicaid recipients. Appropriates funds for the inflationary adjustment for fiscal years 2017-2018 and 2018-2019. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

#### SB312. SD2 RELATING TO OPEN GOVERNMENT.

JUD

Until 7/8/2019, requires certain boards to make board packets available for public inspection and provide notice, upon request, of the availability of board packets. Requires boards to allow oral testimony to be presented on agenda items separately and at the time the item is first brought up for discussion at the meeting. Adds emergency meetings to the public meeting notice requirements. Allows the electronic mailing of meeting notices; requires the posting of the notice on the State's or appropriate county's electronic calendar; and clarifies posting requirements and potential posting disputes. Establishes a board packet working group to develop board packet disclosure requirements. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD2)

#### SB314, SD1 RELATING TO ARBITRATION.

JUD

Clarifies provisions relating to required disclosures by arbitrators. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD1)

#### SB320, SD2 RELATING TO FORENSIC IDENTIFICATION.

JUD, FIN

Requires DNA samples from a felony offender regardless of whether the offender completed a criminal sentence, or was otherwise discharged from the jurisdiction of the court, for the qualifying felony offense prior to July 1, 2017, and retroactively to July 1, 2005. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD2)

#### SB332, SD1 RELATING TO NOTARIES PUBLIC.

JUD, CPC

Prohibits a commissioned notary public from accepting a limited purpose driver's license for verification of identification. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD1)

#### SB334, SD2 RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

JUD, FIN

Enacts voting by mail uniformly across all counties for all elections commencing in 2020. Establishes a limited number of voter service centers that would remain open from the tenth business day preceding an election through the day of the election to receive personal delivery of mail-in ballots, accommodate voters with special needs, offer same day registration and voting, and provide other election services. Allows for additional places of deposit for personal delivery of mail-in ballots. Appropriates funds for the implementation and administration of the election by mail program. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD2)

## SB335, SD1 RELATING TO THE UNIFORM FAMILY LAW ARBITRATION ACT.

JUD

Authorizes the use of arbitration to resolve certain family law disputes. Specifies law applicable to arbitrations. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD1)

#### SB336, SD1 RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

JUD

Excludes from the definitions of "advertisement" and "electioneering communication" the communications of a candidate's name on clothing or other attire not directly associated with that candidate's campaign committee. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD1)

#### SB337, SD1 RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

JUD

Provides that a candidate committee shall not be required to file a statement of information for an electioneering communication made by a candidate committee that clearly identifies the communication as being paid for by the candidate committee. Repeals the requirement that a candidate committee file a statement of information of the names and addresses of all persons who contributed to the committee or the organization for the purpose of publishing or broadcasting the electioneering communications. Excludes any advertisement by a candidate or candidate committee from the reporting requirements for electioneering communication, provided that the advertisement is in compliance with the law regarding advertisements. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD1)

#### SB339, SD1 RELATING TO INFORMATION CHARGING.

JUD

Authorizes all class B and C felony charges to be instituted by written information subject to specified exceptions. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD1)

SB344, SD1	RELATING TO DENTAL ASSISTANTS. Clarifies the allowable and prohibited practices requirements for dental assistants. Clarifies that rules shall not infringe upon, overlap with, or conflict with the duties and scope of practice for other licensed professionals. Prohibits persons from employing, directing, or ordering a dental assistant or other person to perform services or procedures within the scope of practice of dental hygiene. (SD1)	HLT/IAC, CPC
SB347, SD1	RELATING TO MOBILE CLINICS.  Appropriates funds for establishing, staffing, and operating two mobile clinics to serve the homeless population. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	HUS/HLT, FIN
SB352, SD1	RELATING TO THE AGRICULTURAL LOAN REVOLVING FUND. Appropriates moneys to and from the agricultural loan revolving fund. Effective 3/9/2092. (SD1)	AGR, FIN
<u>SB371, SD1</u>	RELATING TO THE BOARD OF DENTISTRY AND DENTAL HYGIENE. Changes the name of the Board of Dental Examiners to the Board of Dentistry and Dental Hygiene. #### <u>SB391, SD1</u> RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS.

CPC, JUD, FIN

Part I: Purpose section. Part II: Clarifies that when a unit owner and association reach a payment plan to cure a nonjudicial foreclosure, completion of the payment plan is required to cure the default; specifies that if a unit owner and an association have agreed on a payment plan to prevent a nonjudicial foreclosure from proceeding, any association fines imposed while the payment plan is in effect shall not be deemed a default under the payment plan; and clarifies the obligations of a unit owner and an association while a unit owner is not otherwise in default under a payment plan. CPC, JUD

Creates criminal penalties for real estate brokers for improper deposit, segregation, or disposition of client trust account funds. Requires the principal broker to report the client trust account number and name of the managing institution to the real estate commission. Specifies that the principal broker must report changes in the account number and account location within ten days of a change. Authorizes certain entities to institute an action in any circuit court to obtain the release or reassignment instrument in the absence of compliance of a mortgagee or record assignee. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD1)

## RELATING TO THE HOSPITAL SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM.

HUS/HLT, FIN

Extends the Hospital Sustainability Program for two years. Appropriates funds out of the Hospital Sustainability Program Special Fund for fiscal years 2017-2018 and 2018-2019. (SD1)

#### SB401, SD1

#### RELATING TO NURSING.

HLT/IAC, CPC

Allows advanced practice registered nurses with a psychiatric specialization to offer care and services to patients in assisted community treatment programs similar to care and services offered by physicians and other health care service providers. Allows advanced practice registered nurses with a psychiatric specialization to be considered a licensed mental health professional authorized to provide mental health treatment or counseling services to minors. (SD1)

#### SB403, SD2 RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE.

HLT/CPC, FIN

Ensures certain benefits under the federal Affordable Care Act are preserved under Hawaii law, including: preserving the individual health insurance mandate for taxpayers; preserving the premium tax credit for individuals and families with low or moderate income; requiring all health insurance entities, including health benefits plans under chapter 87A, HRS, to include ten essential health care benefits, plus additional contraception and breastfeeding coverage benefits; extending dependent coverage for adult children until the children turn twenty-six years of age; prohibiting health insurance entities from imposing a preexisting condition exclusion; prohibiting health insurance entities from using an individual's gender to determine premiums or contributions; and prohibiting health insurance entitles from discriminating with respect to participation against a health care provider acting within the scope of that provider's license or certification. Effective 7/1/2050. Individual mandate requirement repeals 6/30/2021. (SD2)

## SB404, SD2 RELATING TO CHAPTER 245, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES.

HLT/CPC, FIN

Requires retailers engaged in the retail sale of cigarettes, tobacco products, electronic smoking devices, or e-liquid to obtain a retail tobacco permit. Increases the license fee for wholesalers or dealers of cigarettes, tobacco products, electronic smoking devices, and e-liquid. Increases the retail tobacco permit fee for retailers of cigarettes, tobacco products, electronic smoking devices, and e-liquid. Imposes an excise tax on electronic smoking devices and e-liquid sold by a wholesaler or dealer on and after 01/01/2018. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

#### SB407, SD1 RELATING TO COUNTIES.

FIN

Allows the counties to make short term investments with similar authority as the state director of finance. Requires counties' investments in bonds of any improvement district to be of investment grade or supported by the general obligation pledge of the county in which the improvement district is located. (SD1)

#### SB410, SD1 RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING.

LAB, FIN

Clarifies the allowable scope of collective bargaining negotiations regarding the rights and obligations of a public employer. Takes effect 1/7/2059. (SD1)

#### SB412, SD2 RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE.

JUD, FIN

Replaces the Hawaii election campaign fund with the general revenues of the State as the funding source for the operating expenses of the campaign spending commission. Allows the commission to use moneys from the Hawaii election campaign fund for investigations if the commission determines that its operating expenses appropriated from general revenues will be insufficient to cover the costs of investigations. Appropriates general revenues to the commission for operating expenses. Takes effect on 01/07/2059. (SD2)

#### SB419, SD2 RELATING TO SELECTIVE SERVICE.

VMI, HED, FIN

Requires compliance with the Military Selective Service Act to be eligible for enrollment in a state-supported post-secondary institution, qualify for state financial assistance for post-secondary education, or be eligible for state or county employment or service. Provides exceptions. (SD2)

#### SB420, SD1 RELATING TO LASER DEVICES.

TRN, JUD

Makes it a criminal offense to intentionally or knowingly direct the beam from a laser or laser scope at an occupied aircraft under certain circumstances. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD1)

#### SB421, SD2 RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT CAMERAS.

JUD, FIN

Establishes requirements for body-worn cameras for law enforcement officers. Establishes policy guidelines for the use and discontinuance of use of body-worn cameras by law enforcement officers. Establishes certain restrictions on the use of body-worn cameras by on-duty law enforcement officers. Adds retention and deletion requirements for body-worn camera footage. Prohibits certain uses of body-worn camera video footage. Establishes violations of recording and retention requirements. Appropriates funds as a grant-in-aid to each county for the purchase of body-worn video cameras; provided that no funds appropriated to a county shall be expended unless matched dollar-for-dollar by the county. Requires the county police departments to report costs of implementing and maintaining the body-worn camera program to the legislature. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD2)

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#### SB423, SD1 RELATING TO STUDENT MEALS.

EDN, FIN

Prohibits denying a student a meal for the first: (1) 30 days of the first semester of a school year while the student's application for free or reduced lunch is being processed; or (2) week that the student's meal fund balance is zero or negative. Authorizes the Department of Education to adopt rules or policies on the collection of funds for negative student meal balances. Requires a report to the legislature. (SD1)

#### SB424, SD1 RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

JUD

Requires police departments to disclose to the Legislature the identity of an officer upon the officer's discharge or second suspension in a five-year period. Requires disclosure of certain information under the Uniform Information Practices Act after a police officer's second suspension in a five-year period. (SD1)

#### SB425, SD2 RELATING TO LABOR.

LAB, FIN

Requires certain employers with fifty or more employees to provide sick leave to service workers for specified purposes under certain conditions. Defines the terms "service worker" and "employer". Adopts the Revised Uniform Athlete Agents Act (2015), which: expands the definition of "athlete agent", who shall register with the director of commerce and consumer affairs, to include individuals who, for compensation or the anticipation of compensation, serve a student athlete as a financial advisor or business manager; requires reciprocity for athlete agents who are registered in more than one state; strengthens requirements for athlete agent contracts; and strengthens requirements under which athlete agents shall notify the educational institution at which a student athlete is enrolled. Establishes the R.E.A.C.H (resources for enrichment, athletics, culture, and health) program in the department of education's community engagement office to provide a standardized framework and funding for after-school programs in public middle and intermediate schools. Requires health insurance coverage for case management services by qualified mental health providers for victims of sexual violence and abuse. Takes effect on 6/1/2050. (SD2)

SB505, SD1 RELATING TO HEALTH.

HLT, CPC

Requires an opioid therapy informed consent process agreement to be executed between a patient and any prescriber of opioids within the State under certain conditions. Requires the harm reduction services branch of the department of health to develop and make available a template of an opioid therapy informed consent process agreement for use in the State. Specifies the contents of the template. Requires all opioid therapy informed consent process agreements to be filed with the harm reduction services branch of the department of health for monitoring. Formally establishes the Hawaii keiki: healthy and ready to learn program within the department of education. Establishes a special fund and appropriates moneys to expand and sustain the program and for an evidence-based vision screening tool. Appropriates funds to establish school health service coordinator positions in DOH and DHS. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

SB511, SD2 RELATING TO CHILD CARE FACILITIES.

HUS, FIN

Requires DHS to publish reports of child care facility inspections beginning on 1/1/2018, and complaint investigations on DHS's website. Creates an oversight committee for implementation of and compliance with publication requirements. Requires annual reporting to the Legislature. Makes an appropriation. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

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#### SB513, SD1 RELATING TO CONTRACEPTIVE SUPPLIES.

HLT, CPC

Authorizes pharmacists to prescribe and dispense selfadministered hormonal contraceptive supplies to patients, regardless of a previous prescription from an authorized prescriber. Specifies requirements pharmacists must meet prior to prescribing and dispensing contraceptive supplies. Enables pharmacists to be reimbursed for prescribing and dispensing contraceptive supplies. (SD1)

#### SB514, SD1 RELATING TO HEALTH.

Authorizes pharmacists to administer the human papillomavirus, Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis), meningococcal, or influenza vaccine to persons between eleven and seventeen years of age. Specifies requirements pharmacists must meet prior to administering the human papillomavirus, Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis), meningococcal, or influenza vaccine. (SD1)

#### SB518, SD2 RELATING TO INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE.

IAC, CPC

Requires barber, beauty operator, and instructor licensees under the board of barbering and cosmetology to complete a one-time, three-hour training program on intimate partner violence awareness and education. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD2)

#### SB519. SD2 RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.

HUS, JUD

Specifies that citizen complaints against a police officer that involve allegations of domestic violence against a family or household member on the part of the police officer shall not be required to be in writing or sworn to by the complainant. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD2)

#### SB522, SD1 RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

HUS, FIN

Strengthens the safe sleep policy for child care facilities for children less than one year of age, including requiring placement of children on their backs for sleeping and establishing notice and annual training requirements; requires such facilities to report death of a child, employee, or household member, within one day of occurrence, to DHS. Prohibits any lessee who transfers a lease from being placed on the wait list again and from purchasing another lease. Reduces the minimum Hawaiian blood quantum requirement of certain conditions and successors to lessees of Hawaiian home lands from one-quarter to one thirty-second. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD2)

Requires the Chief Information Officer to identify the information technology projects of the executive branch, including DOE and UH, that shall be subject to independent verification and validation. Establishes a prepaid wireless E911 surcharge of 1.5 per cent of prepaid wireless service purchased at the point of sale. Allows sellers to deduct and retain 3 per cent of the surcharges collected to offset administrative expenses, but requires sellers to remit the balance of surcharges collected to the Enhanced 911 fund on a specified periodic basis. ## RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY.

Requires the governor to appoint six Hawaii tourism authority board of directors' members within ninety days of receiving lists of nominees from the president of the senate and from the speaker of the house of representatives. Requires the president of the senate and speaker of the house of representatives to appoint those members if the vacancy continues after ninety days. Requires that executive meeting minutes be available to any legislator upon request. Requires that information relating to market plans and strategies discussed at executive session be disclosed after the execution of the market plans and strategies. Requires the Hawaii tourism authority to report, at least twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session of the legislature, summary descriptions and planned and actual expenditures of contracts and agreements entered into by the authority and a detailed annual budget for the authority for a twoyear period covering the current and immediately preceding fiscal years to the governor, speaker of the house of representatives, president of the senate, and chairs of legislative committees with primary jurisdiction over tourism or financial oversight. Requires that authority expenditures of more than \$50,000 be approved by the board of directors. Repeals the authority's exemption from chapter 103D. Requires the authority to apply rules established pursuant to chapter 103D or create their own rules pursuant to chapter 91 that would supersede the rules of chapter 103D for competitive bidding for certain contracts. Requires that the authority establish an advisory group that meets monthly. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

# RELATING TO THE MOTION PICTURE, DIGITAL MEDIA, AND FILM PRODUCTION INCOME TAX CREDIT.

EDB. FIN

Requires that to qualify for the tax credit a production must provide evidence of recognition, ability to understand, and efforts to respect and comply with cultural and environmental sensitivities in sensitive locations; including employing or contracting for the services of cultural resources or historical, cultural, or language experts to advise the production. Requires that to qualify for the tax credit a production must agree that if the production claims a credit of more than \$8,000,000, the production will provide an advanced screening of the finished product in the county of the island in which the majority of the production took place. Clarifies that qualified expenditures are required to be expended within this State. Places an aggregated annual cap on credits of \$30 million per calendar year. Allows a taxpayer to claim all or some of the credit unused due to the cap in the subsequent calendar year. Requires DBEDT to submit an annual report to the legislature regarding the activities and expenditures of the tax credit. Clarifies that no rule shall be adopted to expand the scope of the tax credit where the rule conflicts with legislative intent. Requires DBEDT to conduct a financial audit of every film production in the State. Requires DBEDT, in collaboration with Department of Taxation, to submit to the governor and the legislature a report on the number of jobs created in the State and the fiscal impact of every film production receiving the tax credit in the State; provided that each report shall be independently verified and audited for accuracy. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

### RELATING TO CARBON FORESTRY CERTIFICATION.

WAL, FIN

Appropriates funds for certification of a reforestation carbon project at Haleakala, Maui, operated by DLNR, under an established forest carbon standard certification system. Requires DLNR to submit an annual report on the project certification to the governor and legislature. Effective 7/1/2099. (SD1)

SB1100, SD1

### RELATING TO RECORDS MANAGEMENT.

EDN, FIN

Requires the department of education to set a standard for retention of student records of not less than one hundred years. Allows the department of education to partner with the Hawaii correctional industries program to establish a three-year student records modernization pilot project. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

#### SB1104 RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST MAUI ALL NATURAL

EEP, FIN

ALTERNATIVE, LLC.

Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to assist Maui All Natural Alternative, LLC with the development of a project to provide municipal sludge processing and renewable energy at the Wailuku-Kahului wastewater reclamation facility on Maui.

#### SB1105, SD2 RELATING TO HOUSING.

HSG, LAB, FIN

Allows the terms of collective bargaining agreements and associated provisions to be deemed the prevailing wages and terms serving as the basis of compliance with chapter 104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for the construction of certain rental housing projects. Expands the types of rental housing projects that can be exempt from general excise taxes. Sunsets on an unspecified date. Takes effect 1/7/2059. (SD2)

#### SB1129, SD2 RELATING TO HEALTH.

HLT, JUD

Establishes a medical aid in dying act that establishes a regulatory process under which an adult resident of the State with a medically confirmed terminal disease may obtain a prescription for medication to be self-administered to end the patient's life. (SD2)

#### RELATING TO SCHOOL IMPACT FEES. SB1146, SD2

HSG, EDN, FIN

Exempts housing developments reserved for persons or families with incomes up to 80% of the area median income located in a county having a population greater than 500,000 from school impact fee requirements. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

#### SB1147, SD2 RELATING TO HOUSING.

HSG/TRN, WAL,

FIN

Requires the strategic plan developed by the Hawaii interagency council for transit-oriented development to require that affordable housing be included as part of the development or redevelopment plan for any state property located within one-half mile of the Honolulu rail transit system, unless the council determines that housing is not feasible or desirable on a particular property. Requires every development or redevelopment plan to include housing with thirty per cent reserved for graduated area medium incomes. Allows a developer to build less housing units than required at one state parcel if the developer builds additional housing at another state parcel within one-half mile of the rail line to offset the reduction.

Effective 12/16/2050. (SD2)

# SB1148, SD2 RELATING TO COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT.

HSG/TRN, WAL, FIN

Appropriates moneys for the executive director of the Hawaii community development authority to conduct a feasibility study regarding: (1) the Hawaii community development authority assuming the role of planning, developing, and redeveloping all state-owned lands, except lands administered by the Hawaii public housing authority, within one mile of the Honolulu rail transit system; and (2) creating a new community development district along the Honolulu rail corridor. Requires report to legislature. Effective 3/15/2092. (SD2)

#### SB1150, SD2 RELATING TO PRESERVING CORAL REEFS.

EEP, OMH, CPC/FIN

Prohibits the use or application of sunscreen, sunblock, or cosmetic containing oxybenzone while on a beach or in the ocean unless the sunscreen, sunblock, or cosmetic is a prescription drug. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD2)

# SB1154 RELATING TO THE HAWAII HURRICANE RELIEF FUND

WAL, CPC, FIN

COMPREHENSIVE LOSS REDUCTION PLAN.

Clarifies that the comprehensive loss reduction plan of the HHRF shall include implementing building code requirements for hurricane standards in accordance with state building code and design standards.

# SB1162, SD2 RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII PROMISE PROGRAM.

HED, FIN

Establishes the University of Hawaii Promise Program to provide scholarships for the unmet direct cost needs of qualified students enrolled at any campus of the University of Hawaii system or any community college campus. Appropriates funds to establish and implement the program. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

#### SB1163, SD1 RELATING TO AERONAUTICS.

TRN, JUD

Replaces criminal penalties for certain airport offenses addressed in the laws relating to aeronautics or in certain administrative rules or orders issued pursuant thereto, with a civil penalty. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD1)

# SB1170, SD2 RELATING TO GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTABILITY.

LMG, FIN

Requires any report of a study or an audit enacted with a legislative appropriation and conducted by an executive department or agency, including the Hawaii health systems corporation, and by the legislative reference bureau, auditor, judiciary, or Office of Hawaiian Affairs, to be submitted to the senate president, speaker of the house, chairs of the appropriate subject matter committee of each house, and the legislative reference bureau library. Requires a public hearing or informational briefing within one year of receipt of report, except if extension granted to the hearing or briefing requirement by the senate president or speaker of the house of representatives or if the requirement is waived by the senate president or speaker of the house of representative. (SD2)

# SB1171, SD1 RELATING TO THE HEALTH CARE PRIVACY HARMONIZATION ACT.

HLT, JUD

Identifies certain circumstances under which the State has a compelling interest in the disclosure, use, and production of deidentified protected health information under the Health Care Privacy Harmonization Act; provided that the information has been de-identified pursuant to title 45 Code of Federal Regulations part 164. (SD1)

# SB1177, SD1 RELATING TO COMMON INTEREST AGRICULTURAL COMMUNITIES.

EDB, FIN

Establishes common interest agricultural communities. Exempts offers or dispositions of interests of land registered as common interest agricultural community from the uniform land sales practices act. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD1)

# SB1178, SD1 MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR HE'EIA NATIONAL ESTUARINE RESEARCH RESERVE.

WAL, HED, FIN

Appropriates funds for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the initial staff necessary to develop and manage the He'eia National Estuarine Research Reserve and its programs. Eff. 3/14/2092. (SD1)

#### SB1183, SD2 RELATING TO TAXATION.

TRN, FIN

Repeals the requirement that 10% of revenues from the county surcharge on state tax be withheld to reimburse the State for administrative costs. Sunsets if an ordinance that allows the capital costs of a rapid transportation system to be paid from county funds is not enacted before December 31, 2017. Requires the mayor of the county to submit certain plans with respect to the rapid transportation system. (SD2)

# SB1189, SD2 RELATING TO THE PRESCHOOL OPEN DOORS PROGRAM.

EDN, FIN

Clarifies the definition of "underserved" or "at-risk" children as it relates to the priority given to these children for the Preschool Open Doors program. Provides that priority among undeserved or at-risk children shall be given to children whose family income is at or below 250 per cent of the federal poverty level. Effective 7/1/2018. (SD2)

# SB1200, SD2 RELATING TO DEVELOPMENT.

FIN

Appropriates funds to the department of accounting and general services to create a master plan and environmental impact statement for the construction of a new Aloha Stadium. Effective 4/2/2050. (SD2)

### SB1201, SD2 RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY.

IAC, WAL, CPC

Specifies that the State and counties cannot prohibit, regulate, or charge for the co-location of small wireless facilities or small wireless facilities networks beyond the provisions of this Act. Provides various state and county zoning rules and classifications regarding the co-location of small wireless facilities and small wireless facilities networks. Describes the application process and rates for co-location. Repeals those sections of Act 151, Session Laws of Hawaii 2011, that have been codified within the Hawaii Revised Statutes. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

## SB1210, SD2 RELATING TO INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT.

HSG, FIN

JUD

Directs the mayor of each county to designate an officer to oversee any public-private partnerships entered into by the county. Authorizes counties to develop public-private partnerships to construct relief sewers for affordable housing development projects. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

### SB1218, SD1

Clarifies that any violation of a mandatory provision of the State's condominium law by a board or its officers and members is a per se violation of the board's fiduciary duty. # SB1299, SD1 RELATING TO CHARTER TOUR OPERATORS.

IAC, CPC, FIN

Provides that charter tour operators may deposit sums subject to section 468L-23, HRS, in a trust account maintained in a federally insured financial institution serving as the depository bank for a public charter program subject to federal regulations. Permits charter tour operators to maintain client trust accounts in a federally insured financial institution located out of State, if certain conditions are met. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

# SB1306, SD1 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM.

EDB, FIN

Establishes an office of public-private partnership within the department of business, economic development, and tourism. Requires that the office create a strategic plan; create collaboration amongst state agencies to identify and implement public-private projects; and oversee and implement the public-private projects. Makes an appropriation. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

### SB1307, SD2 RELATING TO LAND USE.

EDB/HSG, FIN

Allows county councils to establish Neighborhood Revitalization Boards to be administered by the counties for the purpose of developing neighborhood revitalization plans for areas in each county. Allows Neighborhood Revitalization Boards to request funding and requires the counties to provide an unspecified percentage of matching funds for any neighborhood revitalization plan or project that receives state funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

### SB1312, SD2 RELATING TO THE LICENSURE OF MIDWIVES.

HLT, CPC, FIN

Establishes the board of midwifery to regulate the practice of midwifery by certified midwives and certified professional midwives. Requires licensing of certified midwives and certified professional midwives to commence beginning on July 1, 2020. Requires the department of commerce and consumer affairs to convene a working group of interested stakeholders and submit a report to the legislature. Effective July 1, 2050. (SD2)

#### SB1313, SD1 RELATING TO HAWAII FOOD RESILIENCY.

AGR, FIN

Makes various appropriations to implement the recommendations of the increased food security and food self-sufficiency strategy. Requires the Department of Agriculture to establish a strategy and goals for increased food security and self-sufficiency in Hawaii. Effective 3/9/2092. (SD1)
