In consideration of GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE 602 SUBMITTING FOR THE CONSIDERATION AND CONFIRMATION TO THE ISLAND BURIAL COUNCIL, ISLAND OF HAWAI'I, GUBERNATORIAL NOMINEE, MARY MAXINE KAHAULELIO FOR A TERM TO EXPIRE 6-30-2019

The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports Governor's Message 602, nominating Ms. Mary Maxine Kahaulelio to the Island Burial Council, Island of Hawai'i expiring June 30, 2019.

The Island Burial Councils are established under Section 6E-43.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The Councils determine whether to preserve or relocate previously identified native Hawaiian burial sites, recognize lineal and cultural descendants, and provide counsel and advice to the Department.

Ms. Kahaulelio is a resident of Waimea, Hawai'i and an active member of her community. She has previously served as past secretary of the Waimea Hawaiian Homestead Association and the Kipu'upu'u Hawaiian Homestead Association. Ms. Kahaulelio is a volunteer with the Queen Lili'uokalani Children Center. She has been a member of the Hawai'i Island Burial Council for many years. It is in that capacity that she has gained knowledge and experience working with native Hawaiian burial sites, and the laws and administrative rules guiding the disposition of burial sites (including skeletal remains). Aside from sharing that knowledge and experience, Ms. Kahaulelio has proven to be a valuable participant in that process.

Senate confirmation will ensure that Ms. Kahaulelio's knowledge and perspective informs the deliberations of the Hawai'i Island Burial Council until June 30, 2019.
