Ronald Kuroda: Emergency Medical Services Advisory Committee

(1) Why do you want to be a member of the Board?

As a former EMT and current Emergency Department Physician at Queen's Punchbowl and West Oahu, I consider it a privilege to participate in the process of guiding the direction of Hawaii PreHospital care. Over the last 3 years, I have appreciated the ability to learn about EMS across Hawaii and to give input into prehospital priorities.

(2) What do you perceive are the roles and responsibilities of a member of the Board?

A member of the Board is responsible to become educated about the topics brought up at the meetings. That education is then translated into action by speaking up and suggesting direction which would be in the best interest of the State of Hawaii as a whole. A responsibility to keep in mind that membership on the board carries a fiduciary duty to the public.

(3) In what ways do you feel that you can help protect the consumer?

The health care system is an expensive system. It is important to public well being. There are dangers in systems associated with a large amounts of money assigned to protect the public. Being a member of the board allows for critical questioning of movements within the EMS community. Especially the ability to question if new and expensive systems bring true value at appropriate costs to the people of the community/consumers. Having medical background is important to be able to critically determine medical benefit to the lay consumer vs benefit promoted through advertising.

I am a practicing Emergency Department Physician on Oahu. I have been in practice for 7 years at Queen's. I have been active in my physician group's finances, pension plan, and workforce recruiting. I have also taken an active role in the education process for EMS providers through Kapiolani Community College for the last 6 years. These experiences give me a view of EMS Systems as they currently exist and the ability to look for avenues of improvement.

I hope to continue to contribute my experience and critical review of issues and services to suggest the best quality of EMS delivery across the state.
