A. The mission of the State of Hawaii Department of Defense, which includes the Hawaii National Guard (HING) and Hawaii – Emergency Management Agency (HIEMA), is to assist authorities in providing for the safety, welfare, and defense of the people of Hawaii. The department maintains its readiness to respond to the needs of the people in the event of disasters, either natural or human-caused.

The Office of Veterans Services (OVS) serves as the single point of contact in the state government for veterans' services, policies, and programs. The OVS also oversees the seven Hawaii State Veterans Cemeteries.

The Hawaii National Guard Youth Challenge Academy provides at-risk-youth with an opportunity to complete their high school education while learning discipline and life-coping skills.

B. Current Statewide Conditions that have affected agency operations and ability to meet goals resides in the states antiquated hiring process. Of the departments 5,500 employees, 474 are state employees of which 90 positions or approximately 20% of the departments' state positions remain vacant for various reasons. Compounding the issue is that many of our key positions are one deep creating a single point of failure. The department is not allowed to hire until the position is vacated, leaving no ability to cross train the new hire and leaving little continuity.

#### C. Federal Funds:

The Department's Federal funds budget is \$113.6 million with a \$135.8 million total operating budget and \$112.0 million with a \$131.7 million total operating budget for FY2018 and FY2019 respectively. The federal funds are distributed through the National Guard Bureau based upon the Master Corporate Agreement for the various contracted programs. The federal funds associated with the U.S. Department of Defense is not in jeopardy of being lost. However, federal funds available through the Grant program has reduced over the years. This impacts our Office of Homeland Security. These federal funds currently total \$23 million:

D. The Department of Defense prioritizes its budget requests based on the our ability to meet mission requirements and safety of our personnel and the people of Hawaii. Divisions

submit requests that are prioritized within their Division. The BMO consolidates the requests and divisions justify their priorities to the director and deputy director. The Adjutant General is the final approving authority for the department's budget priorities.

Major Adjustments contained in the budget request:

- 1. Adds 1.00 temporary position and \$80,000 in FY 18 and FY19 for a Hawaii State Fusion Center Director.
- 2. Adds 2.00 permanent positions (Account Clerk V and Accountant IV) and \$48,223 in FY 18 and \$86,346 in FY 19 for fiscal Administrative support.
- 3. Adds 2.00 permanent position (Air Conditioning Mechanic ad Electrician) and \$128,224 in FY 19 to provide repairs and maintenance services at Defense facilities.
- 4. Adds \$400,000 (\$100,000 in general funds and \$300,000 in other federal funds) for the National Guard Youth Challenge Academy (increases per cadet funding from \$17,000 to \$18,000), statewide.
- 5. Converts 2.00 permanent positions (Homeland Security Planner and Hawaii State Fusion Center Analyst) from federal funds to general funds.
- 6. Adds \$768,000 in FY 18 to provide tree trimming services (Phase I) at the Hawaii State Veterans Cemetery in Kaneohe.
- 7. Adds \$752,000 in FY 18 to complete various repair and maintenance projects at the Emergency Operations Center.
- 8. Adds \$325,000 in FY 18 for an emergency generator for the new sewer lift station in Diamondhead Crater (joint project with the Department of Land and Natural Resources).
- 9. Adds \$1,906,720 (\$270,000 in general funds and \$1,636,720 in other federal funds) for the Maui Cemetery Restoration Project, Phase II.
- 10. Adds \$43,017 in FY 18 and \$44,739 in FY 19 to fund pay differential related to the Multi-Skilled Worker Team positions at the Hawaii State Veterans Cemetery.
- 11.Adds 1.00 permanent position (Veterans Services Counselor) and \$50,772 in FY18 and FY19, to continue funding to focus on women's issues (Act 209, SLH 2016).

#### E. Highlights of the Executive CIP Budget Request:

- 1. Adds \$3,000,000 in FY18 and FY19 for Retrofit Public Buildings with Hurricane Protective Measures, Statewide.
- 2. Adds \$800,000 in FY18 to complete the Youth Challenge Academy, B1786 and B1787 Railing Replacement and Other improvements, Kalaeloa Project.
- 3. Adds \$10,557,000 (\$2,817,000 in BOG and \$7,740,000 in other federal funds) in FY18 and \$6,015,000 (\$1,510,000 in GOB and \$4,505,000 in other federal funds) in FY19 for Upgrades and Improvements to National Gard Readiness Centers and Facilities, Statewide.
- 4. Adds \$920,000 (\$170,000 in GOB and \$750,000 in other federal funds) in FY18 and \$7,330,000 (\$1,580,000 in GOB and \$5.750, 000 in other federal funds) in FY19 for energy resiliency and Physical Security Projects for Hawaii Army National Guard Facilities, Statewide.
- 5. Adds \$2,500,000 (\$2,499,000 in GOB and \$1,000 in federal funds) in FY18 and \$2,500,000 (\$2,499,000 in GOB and \$1,000 in federal funds) in FY19 for disaster Warning and Communications devices, statewide.
- 6. Adds \$5,449,000 (\$2,850,000 in GOB and \$2,599,000 in other federal funds) in FY18 and \$1,886,000 (\$172,000 in GOB and \$1,714,000 in other federal funds) in FY19 for combined support maintenance shop 2, Keaukaha Military Reservation, Hawaii.
  - 7. Adds \$500,000 in FY18 for Birkhimer Tunnel, ADA Restroom Improvements, Oahu.
- 8. Adds \$141,000 in FY18 and \$1,616,000 in FY19 to renovate Building 306A, for the Hawaii State Fusion Center, Oahu.

Also reflects the movement of several maintenance positions out to the Engineering Office (HIENG) for consolidation of resources.
Pending final approval, anticipated FY 2017.	Reorganization of the present Facilities Management Office and its subordinate Environmental Branch in the Engineering Office to transfer out to the Hawaii Army National Guard Division (HIARNG) as the new Construction and Facilities Management Branch (CFMB). This proposal is required to formally organize these programs to reflect their operations under the HIARNG. This formal reorganization is also required to redescribe and convert exempt project positions to state civil service status.
Pending final approval anticipated FY 2017.	Reorganization of the Office of the Adjutant General (TAG), Hawaii Emergency Management Agency (HIEMA), and Office of Homeland Security (OHS) to reflect the current operations. The TAG has been updated to reflect the new OHS and renamed HIEMA, and other changes of positions in TAG's Office. The OHS was established per Act 175, SLH 2013 and is formally organized out of the former State Civil Defense Division into its own Office. The HIEMA was established and renamed (formerly State Civil Defense) per Act 111, SLH 2014 and this proposal reflects these changes. The proposed HIEMA organization's new structure conforms with the Incident Command System (ICS) promulgated by FEMA, and reflects the conversion of exempt project positions to state civil service status, and supervisory changes.

This reorganization is needed to conform to the National Guard Bureau's Manning Model which governs all of the personnel staffing for the YCA programs nationwide.

In progress, pending revisions and final proposal to be submitted to B&F and DHRD. Final approval anticipated FY 2017. Reorganization of the Engineering Office (HIENG), Hawaii Army National Guard Division (HIARNG) and Hawaii Air National Guard Division (HIANG) to reflect the current working structures. In HIENG, this proposal reflects the transfer out of the proposed CFMB (see third item listed above), and the transfer in of several maintenance positions from other DOD divisions for consolidation of resources. Also reflects a new Engineering and Land Management Services Branch and updated Maintenance Branch. The Hawaii Army National Guard Division (HIARNG) is reorganized to reflect the current working structures, supervisory relations and movement of positions into and out of this Division. Similarly, the Hawaii Air National Guard Division (HIANG) is reorganized to update its structure to reflect its current operations, addition, deletion and transfer of positions.
