Aloha Chair Rhoads, Chair Gabbard, Chair Espero, and Members of the Committees:

I am Randy Cabral, President of the Hawaii Farm Bureau (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,900 farm family members statewide, and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interests of our diverse agricultural community.

HFB strongly supports SCR 176/SR 7, enabling exchange of private lands for State lands in the urban corridor for housing for Hawaii residents.

Transfer of Development Rights is a common mechanism used by States on the Continent to preserve agricultural lands. The practice has not been adopted in Hawaii and SCR 176/SR 70 provides a good alternative.

The majority of agricultural lands are on the neighbor islands. This measure complements HB 1584, implementing the County designation phase of the IAL initiative. We request clarification that the agricultural lands can be located on any of the islands. The Counties should be consulted about their plans for investments in agricultural expansion. We suggest the following changes:

Line 40 page 3:

(1) Obtain large tracts of suitable agricultural lands for the State on any of the Counties to lease to farmers for diversified agriculture; and

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(1) The feasibility of any land exchanges of agricultural parcels of high interest to the State on any of the Counties, in exchange for urbanized lands

HFB respectfully requests your strong support of SCR 176/SR 70 to advance agriculture into the next generation. When enacted, we envision the exchanged lands to be designated as IAL to meet the Constitutional Mandate for future generations.
