Senate Committee on Ways and Means

The Hawaii Department of Transportation (DOT) **supports** S.C.R. 59, S.D.1 which encourages state departments and agencies to duly consider women-owned businesses when awarding state contracts.

DOT administers the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program which provides opportunities for women-owned firms to participate on federal-aid contracts. However, within DOT, the number of professional services contracts are limited, and therefore, encouraging the utilization of women-owned businesses by all state departments and agencies would provide an even greater opportunity for women-owned firms. Passing S.C.R. 59 will serve to level the playing field for women in traditionally male-dominated professions such as construction management, architecture and engineering so long they meet the State's qualifications.
