COLLABORATE TO RESEARCH AND DEVELOP A PLAN FOR INCREASING
WATER CIRCULATION IN POKAI BAY ON LEEWARD OAHU

Senate Concurrent Resolution 88, Senate Draft 2 urges the United States (U.S.) Army Corps of Engineers, the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department), and others, to collaborate to research and develop a plan for increasing water circulation in Pōka'ī Bay on Leeward O'ahu. The Department acknowledges the intent of this measure and provides the following comments.

The intent of this measure is to address concerns with alleged environmental and health risks in Pōka'ī Bay (Bay) due to runoff from surrounding surfaces, illegal dumping and user-induced contaminants.

After a water quality assessment is completed and if improved water circulation is deemed necessary, the Department can work with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to come up with cost estimates to pursue design options that can be provided to the legislature for funding consideration. Studies would also be needed to assess the structural integrity of the breakwater if redesigned, as well as movement of sand when high surf enters the Bay. Unfortunately, the Department does not have the capacity to pay for such research and design studies with our existing operational funds.

The Department notes that it is working to address the issue of boats being moored in the Bay for longer than permitted, through administrative rules.

One day we showed up at the beach, and there were piles of dead file fish and other trigger fish all along the shore. These phenomenal events have led me to not want to take my own child to Pokai Bay. As a fisherwoman, I am aware that fishermen/woman will discard unwanted parts of their catch into the ocean right in front of the harbor. That, coupled with the constant flow of marine traffic and canal runoff leads, and unexplainable wounds lead me to believe that there are unusually high amounts of bacteria that pose a risk to our community.
