In 1898, the Hawaiian language (O'lelo Hawai'i) was officially banned from public schools and government operations. For decades, the numbers of speakers continued to decline, until just a few thousand remained. However, in the 1970's, a resurgence in the native Hawaiian culture and language began, culminating in 1978, with the Hawaiian language once again being designated as one of the official languages in the State of Hawai'i. The Friends of Ka Leo Hawai'i Media was initially an informal hui of Native Hawaiians and Hawaiian language speakers that came together to increase the vitality, growth, and survival of the Hawaiian language through supporting the use of language outside of the classroom in mainstream media. In September 2016, in response to a lack of a dedicated media outlet for Hawaiian language, The Friends of Ka Leo Hawai'i Media was incorporated as a 501(c)(3) to seek funding to create a radio station with 24/7 Hawaiian language programming.

The goals and objectives related to the request;

The goal of this grant request is to establish the 940 am radio station currently a part of The Summit Radio Group as a fully operational radio station to feature Hawaiian language programming 24/7, managed by The Friends of Ka Leo Hawaii Media.

The objective of this grant is to develop a public broadcast program with 30 Hawaiian language speakers as hosts, guests, and listeners of a Hawaiian language/bilingual radio show and increase the vitality and growth of the Hawaiian language within the community, by the end of 12 months.

The public purpose and need to be served;

There are thousands of native Hawaiian speakers who have already

graduated from, or are currently attending the Hawaiian language programs at the University of Hawai'i, 23 public or public charter schools designated as Kaiapuni schools (Hawaiian language and immersion programs) by the Hawai'i Department of Education, the federally funded Punana Leo, and other private institutions. It is estimated that statewide there are 35,000+ people that understand and can converse in the Hawaiian language. The present consensus of the Hawaiian language community is that these individuals exist in pockets all across the state. The radio station and radio station website provide additional hours Hawaiian language speakers can engage in speaking the language, but also reading and listening to Hawaiian language through music, news, and other topics of interest from across the state. The radio program and website are the virtual language support community that connects pockets of Hawaiian language speakers who are otherwise isolated. No statewide outlet to hear, speak, or listen to the Hawaiian language for the community exists.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

The target population to be served will be current residents of the State of Hawai'i who are able to converse in the Hawaiian language and/or its dialects.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

The geographic coverage will be the entire State of Hawai'i, to include the islands of O'ahu, Hawai'i, Maui, Kaua'i, Moloka'i Lana'i and Ni'ihau, and the radio station website will be accessible globally.

II. Service Summary and Outcomes

The scope of the work required to set up the radio station will involve a collaboration of the Friends of Ka Leo Hawai'i Media, The Summit Media Group, community organizations, native Hawaiian groups, as well as individuals who will be compensated and volunteers. Ka Leo Hawai'i Media will recruit Hawaiian language speakers to be hosts/guests representing regional perspectives and topics from Hawaiian communities on 7 islands; Oahu, Maui, Hawai'i Island, Kaua'i, Moloka'i, Ni'ihau and Lana'i.

The project managers from the organization will be tasked with managing the production of a final 52-week radio broadcast show schedule and programming plan, and stream and archive radio shows on the website. The Board of Directors has oversight of the entire process to provide a checks and balance to ensure all fiduciary responsibilities and statutory requirements are met.

 Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service:

The anticipated timeline for the radio station is one (1) calendar year. Based on the date of the actual allotment funding, the organization will proceed as follows:

- Quarter 1 Lease the radio station and equipment and other supplies, hire personnel and start programming formats. Schedule 52 weeks of radio broadcasts (3 live shows a week/3 rebroadcast)
- 2. Quarter 2 & 3 Launch the radio station website with program streaming, and Hawaiian language community content. Increase to 4 live shows a week/4 rebroadcast.
- 3. Quarter 4 Achieve a 24/7 Hawaiian language radio station and website with 6 live shows a week/6 rebroadcast.
- Describe its quality assurance and evaluation plans for the request. Specify how the applicant plans to monitor, evaluate, and improve their results; and

Currently, the organization has two (2) program managers that will be directing the program, along with assistance from The Kalaimoku Group, which will provide detailed and deliberate evaluations on each step of the project's progress. This will include metrics to determine the participation on both the radio program and website.

4. List the measure(s) of effectiveness that will be reported to the State agency through which grant funds are appropriated (the expending agency). The measure(s) will provide a standard and objective way for the State to assess the program's achievement or accomplishment.
