In many ways, North Hawai'i Community Hospital (NHCH) is the continuation of a loving legacy. Makahikilua (the site on which the hospital stands) had centuries ago been a gathering place to celebrate peace and camaraderie. Aunty Lucy Kalanikumaiki'eki'e Davis Henriques left the 12 acres in a trust upon her death in 1932 for the establishment of a medical facility to care for the families of North Hawai'i. In 1977, Lucy Henriques Medical Center opened as the initial phase of what the community hoped would someday become a full-service hospital. In the mid-1980s, the healthcare environment in North Hawai'i began to shift and change in such a way that this dream, which had seemed distant and obscure, began to come into focus. Hundreds if not thousands of people gave their time, money and energy to bring NHCH to life. Beyond this, the new hospital benefited from the new health guidance and wisdom of kupuna (elders) and kahuna (cultural experts), all consecrated with blessings of the aumakua (ancestral guardian spirits).

North Hawai'i Community Hospital is a non-profit community hospital that serves more than 30,000 residents and visitors in North Hawai'i. North Hawai'i Community Hospital opened in May 1996 after decades of dreaming and nearly ten years of planning. Its mission is to improve the health and wellness of the people of North Hawai'i. Its vision emerged from the desire to be "not just another hospital" but rather the most healing hospital in the world.

In January 2014, North Hawai'i Community Hospital became part of The Queen's Health Systems, a not-for-profit corporation established in 1985 to bring expanded health care capabilities to the people of Hawai'i and the Pacific Basin. The Queen's Health Systems mission is to fulfill the intent of Queen Emma and King Kamehameha IV to provide in perpetuity quality healthcare services to improve the wellbeing of Native Hawaiians and all of the people of Hawai'i.

In addition to improving the health and wellness of the people of North Hawai'i, NHCH is also focused on promoting and improving access to health care through outreach, education, technology, and physician recruitment.

The current NHCH Emergency Room (ER) with 6 treatment rooms is over capacity and NHCH plans on expanding the ER square footage to include 13 multi-use rooms. There will be 11 universal treatment rooms, providing low-to medium-level acuity and two trauma treatment rooms, providing high-level acuity. When completed the new space will increase and meet the need for access to 24/7 emergency care in the community and improve patient experience.

The expanded ER will be a new, freestanding structure with a corridor connection back to the hospital. The site of the expanded ER will be on the eastern side of the hospital, adjacent to the existing ER wing.

Current demand for emergency services exceeds the present ER space and with long average lengths of stay, expanded ER services at NHCH will provide improved patient care and flow, and meet the needs of the community. Estimated census projections for the NHCH ER will increase from 14,000 in 2016 to 17,000 in 2025. Currently, there is only one urgent care provider in Waimea, which is not open after 7pm, and no readily available primary care provider access after-hours.

All those within the area served by the NHCH emergency department particularly the elderly, low-income patients, racial and ethnic minorities, women, persons with disabilities, and other underserved groups, will have greater access to life-saving emergency services with the expansion of the ER.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

Hawai'i Island has significant disparities in access to health care due to provider shortages, limited health services, and substantial challenges in transportation. When NHCH does not have the capacity to serve its community and goes on divert, patients must travel a significant distance to either Hilo or Kona to receive medical treatment. The increased capacity of the expanded emergency department at NHCH will facilitate greater access to emergency health care services for this large service area and connect patients with specially trained emergency medicine providers to deliver high quality services and compassionate care that will impact much of the population, from children to older adults.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

The service area of NHCH is extensive and includes the Waimea, Hawi, and North Kona areas as well as the Waikoloa, east Honoka'a, and Pohakuloa Military Training Area.



- 3) If the applicant is a non-profit organization, it meets the following requirements pursuant to Section 42F-103, Hawai'i Revised Statutes:
  - a) Is determined and designated to be a non-profit organization by the Internal Revenue Service; and
  - b) Has a governing board whose members have no material conflict of interest and serve without compensation.

Pursuant to Section 42F-103, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, for grants used for the acquisition of land, when the organization discontinues the activities or services on the land acquired for which the grant was awarded and disposes of the land in fee simple or by lease, the organization shall negotiate with the expending agency for a lump sum or installment repayment to the State of the amount of the grant used for the acquisition of the land.
