A brief description of the applicant's background:

One Ninety Nine Initiative was formed on Monday, March 17, 2014 with the mission to bridge the gap between the un-churched and the local church by; being involved in the local community, building relationships with individuals and pointing to the local church.

One Ninety Nine is a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation passionate about it's "neighbors" and reaching the POOR, the LOST, the SICK and the HUNGRY. We are passionate about the betterment of the community, mankind, and the health of the local church.

Our programs, which we call bridges, include using funds to launder the clothes of those less fortunate / low income families, feed and care for the homeless, and any other needs that arise within the community. To maximize our impact on current efforts, we seek to collaborate with other 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations.

One Ninety Nine currently operates in Kaneohe, Hawaii where it seeks to reach its local community. The population of Kaneohe is an estimated 34,597 (2010 census) of which approximately 7.3% persons fall below the poverty level. Since 2015 we have helped many homeless as well as low-income families through community service called Laundry Love. We've provided over 3,200 loads of laundry through Laundry Love events occurring twice a month.

The state of Hawaii is one of the most expensive places to live with many residents struggling to make ends meet. Hawaii's cost of living is consistently ranked among the highest in the U.S. As a result, there is a steady increase in the total number of homeless individuals within the state with Hawaii having the third-highest ratio of homeless people to residents of any state.

This capitol grant is requested to assist with purchasing a home on the windward side of Oahu, HI.

The goal is to focus on a select number (4 or less) of homeless individuals at a time. We will assist in transitioning these individuals from the streets of homelessness to life as thriving citizens of the community. Each individual will be responsible for having / keeping a job (Laundry Love or other), participating in house chores including cleaning, cooking and abiding by house rules to be enforced by an onsite house supervisor.

3. The public purpose and need to be served:

Benefit to the Homeless

The primary purpose of One Ninety Nine is to love and serve those less fortunate than ourselves through relationship. We desire to go beyond providing "services" and seek to forever change the lives of those that would not otherwise have the opportunity. We will be offering housing, support, counseling and job placement to those homeless that are seeking the opportunity to change their circumstances.

Since 2015, One Ninety Nine has built trusting relationships with the homeless in Kaneohe through providing free laundry wash every other week. We have made it our primary focus to respect the dignity of each human person. Because of these relationships and history throughout the years we strongly believe many of these individuals are more than ready to make a difference in their own lives and the community around them if given the chance.

Benefit to the Community

Transitioning the homeless into housing will reinvigorate the parks, recreation areas and public facilities encompassing the windward side. The community will get new members as positive contributors to society.

One Ninety Nine will continue to promote, fund and maintain laundry services twice a month for homeless and low-income families alike. We will continue to use these services as a vehicle to build relationships and gauge when an individual is open to the idea of changing their circumstances for when a position opens up within the house.
