Shobukan Judo Club is a private, non-profit (501 ©3) entity whose members include students from the ages of 6 years and older to adults (parents, instructors and seniors). Established in 1908, it is one of the oldest judo clubs in the State of Hawaii and the United States. Shobukan's mission statement is to create a nurturing place of trust, integrity, order, fellowship, cooperation and respect for others, and provide the opportunity for each person to learn and grow physically, mentally and spiritually to gain the skills, confidence and discipline needed to become responsibly independent to maximize his potential and serve a worthy purpose to society.

Started by immigrants from Japan in 1908, Shobukan's founding fathers were Kanajiro Mino and Kakuji Fukai, who were Judokas trained in the art of Kodokan Judo. The Club's first dojo (gym) was in the basement of the Asahi Bakery on Beretania Street in Honolulu. At this time, Yajiro Kitayama, a skilled practioner in Judo and Sumo was called over from the island of Hawaii to be Shobukan's first chief instructor.

In 1910, Shobukan moved to the Katojinsha on Hall Street with Kakuji Fukai serving as the Club's chief instructor until 1924. It was during this 14-year period that Professor Sunao Migita, joined the club and became an instructor in 1920, and later became Shobukan's third Chief Instructor.

Shobukan relocated to the Liliha Daijingu in 1924 with Professor Migita serving as the chief instructor. Shobukan flourished in the following years until 1941 when World War II temporarily halted all Japanese martial arts activities.

Shobukan was reactivated in 1947 at the Palama Gakuen and a year later, moved to Kuakini Street in Liliha. In 1957 through the efforts of Professor Migita, club members and friends, Shobukan was able to purchase a property and move to its present permanent site in Liliha in Kunawai Lane.

Dr. Lloyd Migita, the son of Professor Sunao Migita became the fourth Chief instructor since 1979 and continued Shobukan's training program by revamping it with moving drills and mind development concepts.

Currently, since 2011, Professor Lloyd Migita turned over the chief instructorship to his long time assistant Professor Dwight Maeda, who recently celebrated 50 years of judo at Shobukan in 2013.

Over the years, Shobukan has produced several National Champions and Olympians such as Charles Nakashima, 1953 National AAU 150 lb. champion; George Hatae, 1953 National AAU 130 lb champion; Lloyd Migita, 1963 National AAU 150 champion and 1964 US Olympic Trials 150 lb runner-up: Clifton Sunada, 1996 Olympian; and Taylor Takata, 2008 Olympian.

Besides these national and international champions, Shobukan has produced a countless number of black belts all of whom are non-paid volunteers, who have become professionals and leaders in our society, serving our communities and helping make Hawaii a better place to live, in direct agreement with our mission statement.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

Shobukan Judo Club respectfully requests funding in order to build a new judo dojo to replace the current 60 plus year old wooden structure, ensuring continued training of Judo for the community in serving our mission statement.

The current wooden structure is old and termite ridden. Roofers refuse to bid on maintenance of the corrugated roofing, because of safety and liability issues.

The building of a new judo dojo (gym) would enhance the services of the judo club, the community at large and the state.

The public purpose and need to be served;

The public purpose and need to be served is to continue to provide the community's youth, starting at age 6, with the opportunity to achieve spiritual and physical fitness and to nurture trust, fellowship, discipline, confidence, integrity and respect for others. Giving children the opportunity to learn not only self-defense but also "lifelessons" while keeping them positively occupied, can only benefit these youth in their school and home lives. Even active older adults (seniors) have the opportunity through judo to keep physically and intellectually involved. Judo helps create assets to society, not liabilities.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

The target population to be served includes the youth of the community from age 5 through adults and seniors throughout the State of Hawaii.

Describe the geographic coverage.

Although Shobukan is located on the island of Oahu, the successes of Shobukan Judo Club will have an effect both within and outside of the state of Hawaii., through the training of Judo and national competition.


