

The YMCA of Honolulu was founded in 1869 and incorporated under the laws of the Kingdom of Hawai'i in 1882. Every year, we serve more than 100,000 individuals in a variety of programs. YMCA programs and services are open to children, teens, women and men of all ages, faiths and backgrounds. In all our programs, we promote our core values of caring, honesty, respect and responsibility. We are a fellowship of people helping each other to learn, grow and improve our own lives as well as the lives of others. Our programs and services center around three areas of focus: Youth Development, Healthy Living and Social Responsibility.
2. The goals and objectives related to the request;
Funding is requested to contribute toward the rebuild and restoration of a retaining wall at the Leeward YMCA (Waipahu). With the wall falling into disrepair, it has created a health and safety risk for YMCA members and the community at large. The objective is to build a sturdier cement wall and then place the existing wall's lava rocks over the new structure to maintain the look, history, and culture of the Leeward branch and the community.
3. The public purpose and need to be served;
Rebuilding and restoring the retaining wall will provide safety to community members participating in Leeward YMCA activities. In addition to a fitness center and swimming pool, this facility provides youth A+ afterschool programs for local students at Waipahu elementary schools, sports/martial arts classes, music/dance classes, and health education.
4. Describe the target population to be served;
The Leeward YMCA serves children and families in Waipahu and the western portion of Oahu. These communities are diverse and this facility serves families and people of all ages, backgrounds, and cultures. Many beneficiaries of YMCA programs are low-income and have limited options for activities and opportunities like fitness centers, afterschool care, and performing arts classes.
5. Describe the geographic coverage.
Waipahu, Makakilo, Kapolei, Waikele, and the Leeward coast.

Previously, Mr. Broderick was a Family Court Judge where he presided over more than 10,000 cases involving families and children. Mr. Broderick also was the Director of the Hawaii State Judiciary, responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Court system, as well as the Director of the Judiciary's Center for Alternative Dispute Resolution. He has mediated or facilitated many complex public policy cases in Hawaii. Mr. Broderick serves in leadership roles on a number of boards, councils and commissions. He has received numerous awards, all related to strengthening the foundation of Hawaii's community. Mr. Broderick received his undergraduate degree from Stanford University (Phi Beta Kappa) and his law degree from UCLA (Highest Honors).

Mike Doss M.S. M.B.A

Michael J. Doss, is the YMCA of Honolulu's Executive Vice President in charge of Operations, reporting to the President & CEO Michael Broderick. As part of the Association's executive team, Mr. Doss has oversight responsibility for 9 the organization's 10 branches, and has provided oversight and leadership to many capital projects including.

- S2.2M facility renovation (YMCA of Hutchinson, KS)
- Construction of the Leeward Branch
- Redevelopment of the Central Branch (in progress).

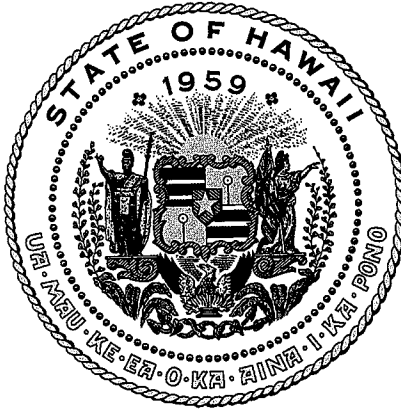

Pursuant to Section 42F-103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for grants used for the acquisition of land, when the organization discontinues the activities or services on the land acquired for which the grant was awarded and disposes of the land in fee simple or by lease, the organization shall negotiate with the expending agency for a lump sum or installment repayment to the State of the amount of the grant used for the acquisition of the land.
