## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VETERANS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 363-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§363-3 Activities of the office. Except as otherwise
  4 provided by law, the office shall:
- 5 (1) Maintain or cause to be maintained, subject to the control and supervision of the office, a center to 6 7 which veterans, including their families and 8 dependents, may come for information, counsel, aid, 9 and assistance, and by which they may be directed or 10 referred to any agency in the community whose function 11 it is, by law or otherwise, to provide the services, 12 assistance, or benefits which in each instance appear 13 necessary or appropriate. Agencies to which any 14 referrals may be made shall include, but are not limited to, departments and divisions of the federal 15 16 and state governments, veterans' organizations, and so-called "private" social agencies; 17

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•	(2)	Abbuild did initiative, in cooperation with agencies in
2		the community, for coordinating all services now
3		available, and which hereafter may become available,
4		for the use and benefit of veterans, including their
5		families and dependents, to the end that maximum
6		effectiveness of the services may be realized, and
7	·	overlapping and duplication of effort as between
8		agencies may be minimized;
9	(3)	Assemble, analyze, compile, and disseminate factual,
10		up-to-date information with respect to:
11	•	(A) Benefits, rights, and services of whatever nature
12		to which veterans, including their families and
13		dependents, are entitled, or which may be
14		available to them; and
15		(B) The structure, functions, area of service, and
16		other pertinent information regarding each agency
<b>17</b>		and organization participating in the veterans'
18		assistance program in the State;
19	(4)	Cooperate with federal departments and other agencies
20	•	which, by law, have responsibility for the
21	•	administration of rights and benefits granted by the

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1		federal government to veterans, including their
2		families and dependents;
3	(5)	As soon as possible after the close of each fiscal
4		year, compile and submit to the governor, for such use
5		or distribution as the governor may deem appropriate,
6		a comprehensive report of the activities and
7		operations of the office, and of all disbursements and
8	•	expenditures authorized by the office under this
9		section; [and]
10	(6)	Inspect every three years all state war memorials and
11		veterans' cemeteries for repair and maintenance
12		deficiencies, and report all repair and maintenance
13		problems at these memorials and cemeteries to the
14		adjutant general, the comptroller, and the legislature
15		prior to the start of the next regular session[-]; and
<b>16</b> .	(7)	Organize, coordinate, and conduct a biennial Hawaii
17		veterans summit. The summit shall assemble any
18		department or division of the federal or state
19		government, veterans' organizations, or any other
20	,	entity in the community whose function is, by law or
21		otherwise, to provide services, assistance, or

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1	benefits to assist veterans and their families and
2	dependents, to discuss and collaborate on issues
3	affecting veterans and their families and dependents.
4	The issues to be addressed shall include benefits,
5	rights, and services available to veterans, and any
6	other pertinent information on assistance for veterans
7	and their families and dependents."
8	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
9	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$400,000 or so much
10	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
11	office of veterans' services to conduct a biennial Hawaii
12	veterans summit.
13	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
14	veterans' services for the purposes of this Act.
15	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
