RELATING TO TAX ADMINISTRATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 235-20.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended to read as follows:		
3	"§23	5-20.5 Tax administration special fund; established.	
4	(a) There	e is established a tax administration special fund,	
5	into which	h shall be deposited:	
6	(1)	Fees collected under sections 235-20, 235-110.9, and	
7		235-110.91;	
8	(2)	Revenues collected by the special enforcement section	
9		pursuant to section 231-85; provided that in each	
10		fiscal year, of the total revenues collected by the	
11		special enforcement section, all revenues in excess of	
12		$[\frac{\$700,000}{$2,000,000}$ shall be deposited into the	
13		general fund; and	
14	(3)	Fines assessed pursuant to section 237D-4.	
15	(b)	The moneys in the fund shall be used for the following	
16	purposes:		

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1	(1)	Issuing comfort letters, letter rulings, written	
2		opinions, and other guidance to taxpayers;	
3	(2)	Issuing certificates under sections 235-110.9 and 235-	
4		110.91;	
5	(3)	Administering the operations of the special	
6		enforcement section; [and]	
7	(4)	Funding support staff positions in the special	
8		enforcement section; and	
9	[-(4)]	(5) Developing, implementing, and providing taxpayer	
10		education programs, including tax publications."	
11	SECT	ION 2. The department of taxation may establish five	
12	new full-time equivalent (5.0 FTE) positions that may be staffed		
13	by investigators, investigator assistants, licensed attorneys,		
14	or other support staff, in addition to using existing employees		
15	of the department of taxation, to staff the special enforcement		
16	section established in Act 134, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, as		
17	exigencies of public service may require. Positions established		
18	pursuant to this section shall be funded with moneys from the		
19	tax administration special fund pursuant to section 235-20.5(b),		
20	Hawaii Revised Statutes.		

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SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 1 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
