STATEMENT OF OBJECTIONS TO SENATE BILL NO. 2519

Honorable Members Twenty-Ninth Legislature State of Hawai'i

Pursuant to Section 16 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawai'i, I am returning herewith, without my approval, Senate Bill No. 2519, entitled "A Bill for an Act Relating to the Environment."

The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Agribusiness Development Corporation (ADC) to enter into contracts with private businesses to remove select municipal solid waste, glass, and food and green waste from the waste stream for use in other businesses, provided that it benefits agriculture and agriculture-related projects.

This bill is objectionable because it provides ADC with broad authority that may interfere with the counties' authority to direct the disposal of municipal solid waste to specific locations. Counties currently have control over waste stream flows under section 340A-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, which authorizes counties to require that all solid waste be disposed of at certain designated facilities or areas. It is unclear whether ADC's or the counties' authority would have priority when determining control over the municipal waste disposal, and allowing ADC to remove certain wastes from the waste stream could interfere with a county's comprehensive solid waste management plan.

For the foregoing reasons, I am returning Senate Bill No. 2519 without my approval.

THE SENATE TWENTY-NINTH LEGISLATURE, 2018 STATE OF HAWAII

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that environmental SECTION 1. 2 concerns are more pressing than ever before and the State should 3 lead by example in terms of moving toward a more environmentally 4 sustainable future. The legislature finds that an effective way 5 to increase environmental sustainability is to diminish the need 6 for landfills by diverting select municipal solid waste, glass, 7 and food and green waste from landfills to produce compost, 8 animal feed, building materials, and energy. The legislature 9 further finds that to continue the march toward long-term 10 environmental sustainability, the State should explore how 11 private businesses can leverage new technology to efficiently 12 process waste streams into usable forms.

13 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the agribusiness 14 development corporation to enter into contracts with private 15 businesses to remove select municipal solid waste, glass, and 16 food and green waste from the waste stream for use in other 17 business sectors, including agriculture, construction, and 18 energy production.

SECTION 2. Chapter 163D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately 3 designated and to read as follows: 4 "§163D- Municipal solid waste diversion. The corporation may enter into contracts with private businesses to 5 6 remove select municipal solid waste, glass, and food and green waste from the waste stream for use in other business sectors, 7 including agriculture, construction, and energy production; 8 9 provided that any contract shall benefit agricultural and 10 agriculture-related projects. The corporation may adopt rules 11 pursuant to chapter 91 necessary to carry out the purposes of 12 this section." SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored. 13

14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
