A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD ABUSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that increasing access 2 and visibility in Hawaii's public education systems of a hotline 3 number designed to help children who are the victims of abuse 4 and neglect will increase reporting of incidents of abuse and 5 neglect. Based on accounts of abused and neglected children, it 6 is evident that teachers are not always able to recognize students who are being abused or neglected. Increasing the 7 8 visibility of and access to the child abuse or neglect hotline 9 and other related information will enable students and victims 10 to better self-report these incidents and enable them to get the 11 help they so desperately need.

12 The purpose of this Act is to encourage students who are 13 victims of abuse or neglect to seek help and to inform them of 14 resources that are available to help them by requiring 15 department of education schools and charter schools to post a 16 sign containing the department of human services child abuse or
