A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LIVESTOCK HARVEST FACILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the cattle industry 1 2 in Hawaii has a long-standing history, beginning with the gift 3 of cattle to King Kamehameha in 1793. The industry has since 4 seen numerous changes in production practices and has adapted to 5 market conditions. The industry was locally focused until the 1990s when it became more cost effective to send cattle to 6 7 pasture on the mainland. Recently, there has been a resurgence in the number of cattle that remain in Hawaii for local 8 consumption, and challenges have arisen due to that resurgence. 9 The legislature further finds that livestock harvest 10 11 facilities in Hawaii have had to adapt to the various industry changes, and the owners of these facilities have had to make 12 difficult decisions over the years to remain competitive and 13 14 continue to serve local markets. After adapting in the 1990s 15 when cattle was predominantly sent to the mainland, many facilities are not equipped to handle the recent resurgence of 16 cattle remaining in Hawaii before harvest. Specifically, these 17



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1 facilities were built for a set throughput of livestock, which 2 makes it difficult to effectively adapt to changing industry 3 conditions. Many facilities need major improvements to remain 4 competitive and serve the community, the significant costs of 5 which can be prohibitive.

6 The legislature believes that the renewed focus on keeping 7 more cattle in Hawaii presents the opportunity to prepare for 8 the future now. Planning and design funding is needed to 9 provide comprehensive and scalable plans for livestock harvest 10 facilities that can be utilized throughout the State. The 11 planning for these facilities would provide for anticipated 12 future growth of the industry and for adaptability to changing 13 throughput for which the existing facilities were never able to 14 account. This effort should provide a model for adaptable use 15 in varied locales, would focus on more efficient processing 16 technologies and equipment, and provide stability within the 17 industry as we continue to expand our local food supply. 18 The purpose of this Act is to support, maintain, and

19 prepare for the future of Hawaii's cattle industry.

20 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,500,000 or so much

thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 for the
 planning and design of scalable livestock harvest facilities.
 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
