A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that anti-tobacco
3	campaigns have played a major role in the overall decline of
4	cigarette smoking. A key tool of tobacco use control has been
5	taxation policy, which has been shown to be particularly
6	effective for youth, who are generally more price-sensitive, and
7	thus less likely to start or maintain cigarette smoking when it
8	is expensive.
9	The health effects of smoking are well established and
10	include increased risk of heart attack, stroke, and other
11	medical events to which Hawaii's emergency medical services
12	system routinely responds. A clear nexus thus exists between
13	cigarette smoking and utilization of the emergency health care
14	system. However, due to declining rates of smoking, the long-
15	term sustainability of the cigarette tax as a revenue source for
16	the emergency medical system special fund is not quaranteed.

- 1 The purpose of this part is to repeal the emergency medical
- 2 services special fund, redirect the fund's revenue sources,
- 3 which are the cigarette tax, motor vehicle registration fee, and
- 4 investment pool returns, to the general fund, and appropriate an
- 5 equal dollar amount to the department of health for purposes of
- 6 overseeing the state comprehensive emergency medical system with
- 7 no discernable disruptions.
- 8 In fiscal year 2015-2016, emergency medical services
- 9 special fund revenues from cigarette sales were \$8,800,000;
- 10 revenues from vehicle registration fees were \$6,538,865; and
- 11 revenues from the investment pool account were \$151,502.46.
- 12 Total emergency medical system special fund revenues in fiscal
- 13 year 2015-2016 were \$15,490,367.46.

    There is established within the state treasury a special fund to

    be known as the emergency medical services special fund to be
    administered and expended by the department.

         (b) The moneys in the special fund shall be used by the
    department for operating a state comprehensive emergency medical
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    services system including enhanced and expanded services, and
11
    shall not be used to supplant funding for emergency medical
12
    services authorized prior to [July 1, 2004].

         (c) Fees remitted pursuant to section 249-31, cigarette
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    tax revenues designated under section 245-15, interest and

    investment earnings attributable to the moneys in the special
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    fund, legislative appropriations, and grants, donations, and
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    contributions from private or public sources for the purposes of
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    the fund, shall be deposited into the special fund.
         (d) The department shall submit an annual report to the

- 3 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the
- 6 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 7 2018-2019 for the state comprehensive emergency medical services
- 8 system.
- 9 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 10 of health for the purpose of this part.
- 11 PART II
- 12 SECTION 8. The legislature finds that a high percentage of
- 13 calls for emergency medical services are from repeat callers who
- 14 call multiple times per day for issues that do not require an
- 15 emergency response. Most 911 calls originate from residences,
- 16 and many involve medical concerns that could be addressed by a
- 17 functioning community paramedic system. The volume of calls for
- 18 emergency medical services rises each year due to growth in
- 19 population and tourism and often outpaces the availability of
- 20 resources. The legislature finds that community paramedic
- 21 services can provide appropriate services to non-emergency

- 1 callers who would otherwise be using valuable emergency medical
- 2 services needed by other individuals by addressing calls
- 3 involving non-emergency services, post hospital discharge care,
- 4 the homeless population, hospice care, behavioral health, and
- 5 acute and chronic medical conditions such as infectious
- 6 diseases, diabetes, hypertension, and asthma.
- 7 The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds to the
- 8 department of health for community paramedic services.
- 9 SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the general
- 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the
- 12 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 13 2018-2019 for community paramedic services.
- 14 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 15 of health for the purposes of this part.

- 17 SECTION 10. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 19 SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2090.
