A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature has funded and created		
2	programs to service chronically homeless individuals. However,		
3	government cannot force an individual who is homeless to stay in		
4	a shelter or receive such services. As a result, there are		
5	hundreds of homeless individuals who decline help from		
6	government and choose instead to sleep unsheltered on the		
7	streets.		
8	The purpose of this Act is to provide an incentive to bring		
9	chronically homeless individuals to shelters and off the		
10	streets.		
11	SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
13	and to read as follows:		
14	"§346- Homeless incentive program. (a) The department		
15	of human services, in conjunction with the governor's		
16	coordinator on homelessness, shall establish a homeless		
17	incentive program to encourage chronically homeless individuals		

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1	to get off the streets by using the services of shel	ters in the	
2	State.		
3	(b) A chronically homeless individual shall be	paid \$12	
4	per twenty-four-hour period for each overnight stay	by the	
5	individual in a shelter; provided that:		
6	(1) The shelter has enough space in compliance	with health	
7	and safety standards to accommodate the in	dividual;	
8	and		
9	(2) The individual is in compliance with the r	equirements	
10	and rules of the shelter.		
11	(c) The \$12 payment to a qualified individual	under	
12	subsection (b) shall not be contingent on any requir	ement other	
13	than as specified in this section.		
14	(d) The department of human services shall ado	pt rules to	
15	carry out the purposes of this section.		
16	(e) As used in this section, "chronically home	less	
17	individual" means a homeless individual with a disab	ility who:	
18	(1) Lives either in a place not meant for huma	<u>n</u>	
19	habitation, a safe haven, or in an emergen	cy shelter,	
20	or in an institutional care facility if th	e individual	
21	has been living in the facility for fewer	than ninety	

1		days and had been living in a place not meant for	
2		human habitation, a safe haven, or in an emergency	
3		shelter immediately before entering the institutional	
4		care facility; and	
5	(2)	Shall have been living as described in paragraph (1)	
6		continuously for at least twelve months, or on at	
7		least four separate occasions in the last three years,	
8		where the combined occasions total a length of time of	
9		at least twelve months. Each period separating the	
10		occasions shall include at least seven nights of	
11		living in a situation other than a place not meant for	
12		human habitation, in an emergency shelter, or in a	
13		safe haven."	
14	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general	
15	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much	
16	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the		
17	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year		
18	2018-2019	for implementation of the homeless incentive program	
19	established in this Act.		
20	The	sums appropriated shall be expended by the department	
21	of human	services for the purposes of this Act.
